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**Bill Analysis**

HB 2314 modifies the Pharmacy Audit Integrity Act. The measure specifies that an entity conducting an audit on a pharmacy must provide notice via a certified letter and that a miscalculated day supply of less than 25% shall not constitute fraud. Additionally, the measure requires any audit on a pharmacy to include the pharmacy benefit manager owning or managing the pharmacy site. The measure provides for a pharmacy to produce documentation correcting a discrepancy within 90 days of the audit. Audits may not require a pharmacy to break open “for single-patient use only” packages. The annual audit total shall be inclusive of all prescription-related documentation requests from the health insurer, pharmacy benefits manager or any third-party company conducting audits on behalf of the health insurer or pharmacy benefits manager during a calendar year.
