**Bill Analysis**

SB 1115 provides for a school district board of education to renew the emergency or provisional teaching certificate of an individual provided he or she meets certain qualifications. The individual must have been employed by the school district for at least two years, not have successfully completed required competency examinations, submitted a portfolio of his or her work to the school board, and receive the board's approval to continue his or her employment. The school district renewing an emergency or provisional teaching certificate must notify the State Board of Education of the renewal. The school board is also authorized to continue renewing the certificate without limitation and may continue to pay the individual at an entry level of the teacher salary schedule.

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
