**Bill Analysis**

SB 1120 creates a task force to study the possibility of requiring each high school student to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid prior to graduation. The task force will be comprised of nine members, including representatives from school districts with varying student populations, a senator, a House member and members from higher education. Appointments to the task force shall be made no later than 30 days after the effective date of this measure. The task force shall meet no later than September 1, 2020. Members of the task force shall not receive compensation or travel reimbursements and shall be subject to the Open Meetings Act. The bill requires the task force to submit a report of its findings and recommendations by December 31, 2020.
