**Bill Analysis**

SB 1166 redefines the term “barbering” within the Oklahoma Cosmetology and Barbering Act by removing treatments with oils, creams, lotions, or other preparations from the job description of a barber. The measure also removes the terms “cosmetology studio” and “hairbraiding technician” from the Act. Under the provisions of this measure, cosmeticians and hairbraiders are not required to obtain a license from the Board. Demonstrators are also no longer required to obtain a “demonstrator” license from the Board. Hair braiding and hair arranging are also defined by the measure.
