**Bill Analysis**

SB 1236 authorizes the Department of Corrections to create a pilot reentry program that offers evidence-based practices to assist inmates through education and rehabilitation with an emphasis on intensive, comprehensive post-release services. The measure requires the pilot program to focus on higher educational programs, core education classes provided by closed-circuit programming from off-site education institutions or instructor-led programs, reentry services, step down and transitional support services, and development of public-private partnerships to provide the listed services. SB 1236 requires inmates to be enrolled in the program for a minimum of 24-30 months.
