**Bill Analysis**

SB 1256 defines “contributory conduct” within the Oklahoma Crime Victims Compensation Act as criminal or illegal provocation, consent, or any other behavior of the victim which directly or indirectly contributed to his or her injury or death. The measure specifies that the Crime Victims Compensation Board must consider certain factors outlined in the measure as it relates to contributory conduct when determining the level of compensation.
