Bill Analysis

SB 1353 requires all law enforcement agencies in the state to have 25% of its full-time employed peace officers to receive trained in crisis intervention by November 1, 2023. Such training shall be offered by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. The Council on Law Enforcement Education Training is directed by the measure to offer at least 4 hours of crisis intervention training in its basic training courses for law enforcement certification. Officer must receive at least 1 hour of crises intervention training for continuing education beginning January 1, 2021.

Introduced—Requires all law enforcement agencies to have 25% of their full-time CLEET certified peace officers to receive crisis intervention training as provided by ODMHSAS, by Nov. 1, 2023. Adds mandatory 1-hour on crisis intervention to continuing law enforcement training for active reserve peace officers. Adds a minimum of 4-hours of education and training on crisis intervention to required basic training courses for law enforcement certification. DMHSAS already provides this training free of charge around the state, several times a year.
