**Bill Analysis**

SB 1447 creates the Access to Petition Act. The measure states that no individual may be denied access to any public retail business location that is located within 100 feet of a public street or public walkway if the individual is informing the public or gathering signatures for any properly formatted and certified federal, state or municipal government petition. Such individuals must possess a properly formatted petition packet, be located no closer than 20 feet to an entrance, and not possess a banner greater than 11x17 inches in dimension. Two folding chairs may be utilized by said individuals, provided the chairs are not prohibited due to safety reasons.
