**Bill Analysis**

SB 1453 requires undergraduate courses offered through Oklahoma State University/Tulsa and institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education in Tulsa and Wagoner counties to only duplicate those offered at Tulsa Community College through concurrent enrollment in school districts in municipalities with a population over 100,000. The measure directs such courses to be phased in over a 3-year period beginning with the 2021-22 academic year, with priority status given to courses in high demand. The measure allows an institution of higher education to enter into a memorandum of understanding with a school district in a municipality with a population over 100,000 to create a degree pathway.

**Fiscal Analysis**

FY'21 Impact: \$2,272,715.00 (estimate)

This bill allows duplication of certain courses offered by institutions within the the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education in Tulsa and Wagoner counties offered by Tulsa Community College through concurrent enrollment in school districts located in municipalities with a population over 100,000. Those courses offered will be phased in over a 3-year period. Authorizes the State Regents to promulgate rules to implement these provisions.

Per the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education: The estimated potential annual fiscal impact to Tulsa Community College would be \$2,272,715. This estimate is based on their reported total dollars waived for 2018-2019.
