**Bill Analysis**

SB 1649 defines “student electrical intern” and “listed electrical apprentice” within the Electrical License Act. The measure directs the Construction Industries Board to issue a license as a listed electrical apprentice to any person who has been certified by the Committee of Electrical Examiners as having 10,000 hours of experience or more as an electrical apprentice. Associated fees for the license are set at the same rate as the registration for electrical apprentices. The fee for an electrical intern registration is set at half the amount of the fee for the registration of electrical apprentices.

The measure also prohibits electrical apprentices from supervising the work of a registered electrical intern. Only one intern may work on a job site under a single journeyman or electrical contractor; however, the intern shall not be counted against the maximum number of apprentices who are allowed to work under a journeyman. Up to 2 electrical apprentices may work on a job site under a single journeyman or electrical contractor.
