**Bill Analysis**

SB 1744 directs the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to create a Livestock Offender Registry. The Registry shall contain all persons who are convicted of stealing livestock or goods relating to maintaining livestock. The county in which the offender is convicted shall submit a copy of the sentence to the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry confirming the conviction.
