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**Bill Analysis**

SB 1765 renames the Home Bakery Act to the Cottage Food Act. The measure modifies the qualifications of a home food establishment by increasing the limit on such entities' sales from \$20,000.00 to \$50,000.00. The measure also authorizes such an entity to conduct a sale over the Internet, provided the entity conducts such sales on its own website. Home food establishments may sell baked goods that are not affected by time and temperature control as it pertains to food safety. The measure outlines additional goods such establishments may offer.

Vegetables sold by an establishment must be delivered by the establishment directly to the consumer and must be stored at an air temperature not exceeding 32 degrees Fahrenheit. Pickled fruits or vegetables may only be sold if the recipe was approved and tested by the Robert M. Kerr Food and Agriculture Products Center at Oklahoma State University or a food laboratory approved by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry.

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
