Bill Analysis

SB 1799 replaces the Home Bakery Act of 2013 with the Homemade Food Freedom Act. The measure removes the \$20,000.00 annual gross sales limit placed on formerly known home food establishments. The measure instead regulates products and classifies said products as either potentially hazardous or non-potentially hazardous food. The sale of non-potentially and potentially hazardous food is exempted from licensing requirements promulgated by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry. The measure requires potentially hazardous food to be affixed with a label as described in the measure. Homemade products may not contain any meat. The measure also clarifies that none of its provisions shall constrain the Department from investigating any reported foodborne illness.
