Bill Analysis

SB 1807 modifies the list of persons eligible to file for an expungement of their criminal record. The measure removes persons who committed a crime under the age of 18 and received a pardon. Persons who were charged with a non-85% felony, with dismissed charges after the successful completion of a deferred judgment or delayed sentence, have never been convicted of a felony, with no misdemeanor or felony charges pending, and with at least 10 years passed since the charge was dismissed may file for expungement. The measure also provides for persons filing for expungement to elect to place their initials in the caption of the court case, excepting persons convicted of an offense of domestic abuse, domestic violence, or stalking.
