**Bill Analysis**

SB 287 modifies convictions for a second felony offense. The measure states that any person that was previously convicted of a felony, except for violent crimes as provided by law or for sex offenses which require registration, and is convicted of a second or subsequent felony offense, other than one considered a violent crime as provided by law or a sex offense which requires registration will receive not more than the maximum sentence plus one-fourth of the sentence that could have been imposed for a first conviction of the current offense.
