## **Fiscal Analysis**

FY'20 Impact: Depends on whether or not districts use the trainers provided by DMHSAS Full Year Impact: same as above

DMHSAS, through the Youth Mental Health First Aid program, has employees that provide training at no cost to districts. Districts can also use trainers who are contracted with DMHSAS but this may have a cost that will vary. Additionally, districts can use the "train the trainer" model that will cost approximately from \$21,500 to train 16 staff to \$36,200 to train 30 staff. While each district may not need this many trainers, they can join together to implement the training program.
