**Bill Analysis**

SB 612 prescribes penalties for possessing a fake marijuana license or for assuming the identity of another person to use a marijuana license. If a person is convicted for committing either act, the penalty is set at no more than one year imprisonment, not more than \$500.00, or both.

**Fiscal Analysis**

FY'20 Impact: Possible increase in fines, dependent on crimes

Full Year Impact: Possible increase in fines, dependent on crimes

SB 612 creates a crime of possessing/using a counterfeit medical marijuana license or impersonating someone with their medical marijuana license. Both crimes will be misdemeanors with no more than 1 year in county jail and a fine of no more than \$500.
