**Bill Analysis**

SB 656 directs the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) to include in its basic training courses for law enforcement certification a minimum of six hours of training relating to recognizing mental illness or substance abuse. Training courses shall also include criteria for emergency orders of detention and developed in conjunction with the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. The measure also decreases the number of mandatory training hours related to recognizing oil theft from four hours to two hours.
