Bill Analysis

SB 664 defines smoke and carbon monoxide detection devices as “mechanical or electronic security devices” as they relate to the Alarm, Locksmith and Fire Sprinkler Industry Act. The measure also defines “circumventual information,” “driver license,” and “passport.” The measure renames the Alarm and Locksmith Industry Committee to the Alarm, Locksmith and Fire Sprinkler Industry Committee and requires members of the same category on the committee to be from a small business and large corporation respectively.

One member must be a subject matter serving as a non-voting member and may be replaced at will by the Commissioner of Labor. Members of the Committee may also be removed for cause by the Commissioner. No person may engage in the fire sprinkler business without obtaining a license under the Act. The measure requires applications for licensure under the Act to include a digital jpeg photo and a valid copy of his or her passport, driver license or state ID.
