Bill Analysis

SB 687 transfers agency responsibilities in the Household Goods Act of 2009 and the Motor Carrier Act of 1995 from the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC) to the Department of Public Safety (DPS). The measure authorizes DPS to employ as many Port of Entry officers as needed and removes the cap of four special Port of Entry officers under the OCC. The measure designates two types of Port of Entry officers, commissioned and noncommissioned.

Fiscal Analysis

FY'20 Impact: \$40,000.00-\$50,000.00

SB 687 transfers the overweight truck enforcement functions from the Corporation Commission to the Department of Public Safety with the funds flowing through ODOT. OMES estimates a \$40,000-\$50,000 onetime cost to transfer employees and equipment. OCC writes approximately \$3.5 to \$4 million each year in overweight violations. That money would now flow through ODOT to pay for DPS's enforcement.

Section 44 of the measure proposes to amend 47 O.S. § 230.9 by allowing the Department of Public Safety in order to recover administrative penalties imposed by the Commissioner of Public Safety against persons violating recordkeeping, safety or other provisions of the Oklahoma Motor Carrier Safety and Hazardous Materials Transportation Act to file an itemization of unpaid administrative penalties, fees, and charges with the Oklahoma Tax Commission for collection at the time of the violator's vehicle registration. It further provides that OTC shall not issue or renew a vehicles registration upon receipt of an itemization of unpaid administrative penalties, fees, and charges from the Department of Public Safety until paid.
