## **Bill Analysis**

In addition to other prerequisites to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program required by current law, SB 80 allows students to complete an educational program that was provided through a means other than a public or private school within three years of applying to the program. The measure also requires students to have performed at a proficiency level on statewide assessments in grades nine through twelve.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

FY2021 – 10 additional recipients - \$50,000.00 FY2022 – 19 additional recipients - \$90,000.00 FY2023 – 26 additional recipients - \$130,000.00 FY2024 – 32 additional recipients - \$170,000.00 FY2025 – 36 additional recipients - \$200,000.00

There are usually about 100 home school students enrolled in OKPromise in each high school graduating class. Of these, 30-50 normally meet the current requirements to be eligible for the OKPromise scholarship. We don't have any data to determine how many additional students might receive the scholarship under this provision. However, assuming it adds another 10 scholarship recipients with each high school graduating class, the estimated impact would be the following.
