**Bill Analysis**

SB 864 creates the Human Trafficking and Child Exploitation Prevention Act. The measure prohibits a business, manufacturer, wholesaler, or individual that makes content available on the Internet from operating in the state unless the product contains an active and operating digital blocking capability that renders any obscene material inaccessible. Content producers must render child pornography sites and sites that facilitate prostitution inaccessible. Digital blockers may be removed at the request of an adult user, provided the user pays a \$20.00 fee for the devices deactivation.

A business or individual that violates the provisions of this measure is subject to a term of imprisonment lasting no more than one year and a fee of \$1,000.00. The Office of the Attorney General is authorized to seek injunctive relief against any business or individual violating the provisions of this measure.
