## **Bill Analysis**

SB 976 renames the "Home Bakery Act of 2013" to the "Home Food Processing Act." The measure modifies the "home food establishment" by allowing the establishment to maintain gross sales of up to \$100,000.00. Current law establishes the cap at \$20,000.00. The measure also requires the establishment to produce non-time/non-temperature control for safety food, which includes jams, spices, candies, and dried goods. Home food establishments may not prepare and sell food that requires temperature control and time to eliminate harmful microbes, such as raw meat, sprouts, cut melons, cut leafy greens, cut tomatoes, or mixtures of cut tomatoes. Food already processed to achieve sterility is not included in the definition of "time/temperature control for safety food." Home food establishments must affix a label to products produced by such establishments in a format approved by the Food and Drug Administration.
