L8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:						
L 9	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 650.4, is

21	Section 650.4 A. Every person who, without justifiable or						
22	excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any

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duties, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony misdemeanor

punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of

Corrections county jail for a term not exceeding two (2) years one

(1) year, or by a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars
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(\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

B. As used in this section, "emergency medical care provider" means doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, laboratory technicians, radiologic technologists, pharmacists, physical therapists, physician assistants, hospital chaplains, medical students, nursing students, pharmacy students, hospital employees and members of a hospital security force.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 650.5, is amended to read as follows:

Section 650.5 Every person who, without justifiable or excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any aggravated assault and battery or any assault with a firearm or other deadly weapon upon the person of an emergency medical technician or other emergency a medical care provider, as defined in Section 650.4 of this title, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in a state correctional institution the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term not more than one (1) year exceeding five (5) years, or by a fine not to exceed
