This bill requires the State Board of Education to provide, through a data exchange, truant student information to the Office of Child Abuse Prevention. Also requires the Board to provide information on students with documented developmental disabilities to the Child Welfare Services of the Department of Human Services.

To meet the requirements, the State Department of Education will have to create a reporting mechanism to collect truant student information from school districts. It will also have to establish a method to exchange this data with the Office of Child Abuse Prevention. This will require a system enhancement to the WAVE application where data is collected. SDE requested a fiscal impact from OMES ISD. They estimate a one-time cost of \$20,810. This was based on the previous version of the bill before it was amended to include the transfer of data on individuals with document disabilities from SDE to DHS Child Welfare Division. SDE estimates a one-time cost of \$10,000 for this data transfer to occur.
