The measure proposes amendment to Section 1356(79) of Title 68 to include a sales tax exemption for sales of tangible personal property by the American Legion.

Oklahoma Tax Commission sales tax remittance records indicate that the American Legion's state sales tax collections totaled \$64,852 in FY 19. The measure proposes an effective date of November 1, 2020. Assuming similar sales as those experienced in FY 19 and applying growth rate adjustments, $^{\rm I}$ an estimated decrease in state sales tax collections of \$39,775 for FY 20 $^{\rm 2}$ and \$69,960 for FY 21 is projected.
