TAX TYPE (S): Income Tax **SUBJECT:** Administrative

PROPOSAL: Amendatory

SB 1572 amends 68 O.S. §205.2, to allow an individual income tax refund to be intercepted and applied to a debt owed to a municipal government, and authorities or trusts with the municipal government as a beneficiary, seeking to recover expenses related to emergency medical services.

Under current law, only state agencies, municipal courts, district courts, public housing authorities and district attorneys seeking to collect unpaid court-ordered monetary obligations may seek to collect a debt, unpaid fines and cost or final judgment of at least \$50.00 from an individual's state income tax refund by filing a claim with the Tax Commission.
