Research Analysis

HB 3954 recognizes nonresidents of Oklahoma with valid medical marijuana licenses from their respective states as license-holders in Oklahoma so long as they abide by the legal possession limits. The measure requires the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) to publish a list of other states that authorize the use of medical marijuana, as well as pictures of the licenses from each state, for dispensaries to use when verifying valid out-of-state licenses at purchase, and lays out penalties for dispensaries that do not verify out-of-state licenses.

Additionally, the measure says medical marijuana businesses that have submitted a certificate of compliance with the municipal government in which it resides to the OMMA do not need any additional certificates of compliance for license renewal unless there is a change to the facility that requires additional inspection, licensure, or permits.

The bill adds that medical marijuana products must be sold in containers that are safe, child-resistant, opaque packaging. It specifically prohibits plastic sandwich bags, one-use zipper or slider storage bags, and plastic or cling wrap.

The measure also clarifies that the 1,000 feet prohibited between a school and a medical marijuana dispensary will be measure from the nearest property line of the school to the front door of the dispensary.
