HOUSE BILL 1277

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to Medicaid; extending billing cycle for Oklahoma Medicaid program for Home and Community Based Services; providing certain expenses shall not be subject to reimbursement; allowing subsequent claims in certain circumstances; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5051.6 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

To the extent allowed under federal law, any provider enrolled in the Oklahoma Medicaid program may bill the Oklahoma Health Care Authority for Home- and Community-Based Services performed up to one (1) year after the date the service was performed. Travel expenses shall not be subject to reimbursement. If a claim is initially denied, the provider may submit a subsequent claim up to one (1) year after the date the original claim was denied; provided, the provider may only utilize this provision once per claim.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.

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
