## 1 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 2 1st Session of the 57th Legislature (2019) By: Hasenbeck 3 HOUSE BILL 1364 4 5 6 AS INTRODUCED 7 An Act relating to career and technology education; directing State Board of Career and Technology Education to review and approve career-readiness 8 assessments and credentials; providing contingency 9 for funding availability; requiring cooperation with the Department of Labor; making assessments available 10 to school districts by certain year; authorizing administration to students in grade twelve; mandating 11 credential for student meeting prescribed level on assessment; requiring minimum administration at no 12 cost to student; listing assessment requirements; providing for codification; providing an effective 1.3 date; and declaring an emergency. 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 16 A new section of law to be codified SECTION 1. NEW LAW 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-135 of Title 70, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 Subject to the availability of funds, beginning with the 2019-20 2020 school year, the State Board of Career and Technology 2.1 Education, in cooperation with the Department of Labor, shall review 22 and approve career-readiness assessments and assessment-based 23 credentials that measure and document foundational workplace skills. 24

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- The assessments shall be available to all public school districts to administer to all students in grade twelve for the first time in the 2019-2020 school year and each subsequent year. The assessment-based credential shall be available to any student who achieves the prescribed level on the required assessments. If the public school district chooses to administer the assessments, the assessments shall be administered at least once to each student in grade twelve at no cost to the student. The assessments shall:
- 9 1. Be a standardized, criterion-referenced measure of broadly 10 relevant foundational workplace skills;
  - 2. Assess and document student readiness for a wide range of jobs;
    - 3. Measure skills in all or any of the following areas:
      - a. applied mathematics,
      - b. workplace documents, or
      - c. graphic literacy;

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- 4. Align with research-based skill requirement profiles for specific industries and occupations;
- 5. Lead to nationally recognized work-readiness certificates or credentials for students who meet the minimum proficiency requirements on the component assessments; and
- 22 6. Be available in paper- and computer-based formats.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.

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SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
