7	An Act relating to motor vehicles; creating the Oklahoma Safe Freight Act; defining term; requiring

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-103H of Title 47, unless
17	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A. This section shall be known and may be cited as the
19	"Oklahoma Safe Freight Act".
20	B. As used in this section "side underride guard" means a
21	device installed on or near the side of a trailer or semitrailer
22	that prevents or limits the probability that a vehicle striking the

side of the trailer or semitrailer with the device will slide under

the side of the trailer or semitrailer in a side-impact crash.

- C. No later than January 1, 2022, all trailers or semitrailers manufactured, sold or registered in this state shall be equipped with side underride guards that meet the performance standards described in subsection D of this section if:
- 1. The trailer has a gross vehicle weight rating of ten thousand (10,000) pounds or more; or

- 2. The semitrailer has a gross vehicle weight rating of ten thousand (10,000) pounds or more.
- D. A side underride guard shall be considered to meet the performance standards required by this section if the side underride guard is able to prevent intrusion from the body or frame of a vehicle into the passenger compartment of a passenger motor vehicle that contacts the guard while traveling thirty-five (35) miles per hour at any angle between ten (10) degrees and ninety (90) degrees.
- E. To ensure that all trailers and semitrailers are maintained in safe and proper operating condition at all times, the Department of Public Safety shall require that any trailer or semitrailer involved in an accident, as defined in Section 390.5 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, or a successor regulation, undergo and pass an inspection, as described in appendix G to subchapter B of Chapter III of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, or successor regulations, to certify that all components of the trailer, semitrailer or single-unit truck, as applicable, are in safe and proper operating condition.

F. The Department of Public Safety shall require drivers to conduct a pretrip inspection of the comprehensive underride protection system required under this section on their trailers or semitrailers to ensure the dimensional integrity of such guards. Pretrip inspections shall be required to identify any metal perforated by rust or corrosion that compromises structural integrity, cracked welds, cracked or fractured vertical members, cuts and tears in any underride guard and missing fasteners and loose fasteners. The results of these inspections shall be included in a driver vehicle inspection report. In addition, drivers are to complete any necessary repairs to, or replacement of, the underride protection system before the vehicle is operated.

G. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
