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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 7 O.S. 2011, Section 19.1, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 19.1 A. Any blind, physically handicapped, deaf or
16	hard-of-hearing person physically or mentally handicapped person who
17	is a passenger on any common carrier, airplane, motor vehicle,
18	railroad train, motorbus, streetcar, boat, or any other public
19	conveyance or mode of transportation operating within this state or
20	any dog <u>animal</u> trainer from a recognized training center
21	organization when in the act of training guide, signal, or service
22	dogs animals shall be entitled to have with him or her a guide,
23	signal, or service dog animal specially and individually trained or
24	being specially and individually trained for that purpose to do work

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or perform tasks for a person with a disability, without being required to pay an additional charge therefor, but shall be liable as hereafter set forth in subsection B of this section.

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B. A blind, physically handicapped, deaf or hard-of-hearing physically or mentally handicapped person and his or her guide, signal, or service dog animal or a dog an animal trainer from a recognized training center organization in the act of training guide, signal, or service dogs animals shall not be denied admittance to or refused access to any of the following because of such dog animal: Any street, highway, sidewalk, walkway, any common carrier, airplane, motor vehicle, railroad train, motor bus, streetcar, boat, or any other public conveyance or mode of transportation, hotel, motel, or other place of lodging, public building maintained by any unit or subdivision of government, building to which the general public is invited, college dormitory and or any other educational facility to which the public may only have limited public access for safety reasons, restaurant or other place where food is offered for sale to the public, or any other place of public accommodation, amusement, convenience, or resort to which the general public or any classification of persons from the general public is regularly, normally, or customarily invited within the State of Oklahoma. Such blind, physically handicapped, deaf or hard-of-hearing person physically or mentally handicapped persons or dog trainer animal trainers from a recognized training center

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- organization in the act of training guide, signal, or service dogs

 animals shall not be required to pay any additional charges for his

 or her guide, signal, or service dog animal, but shall be liable for

 any damage done to the premises by such dog animal.
 - C. A dog used by a deaf or hard-of-hearing person shall be required to wear an orange identifying collar.
 - D. For the purposes of this section and Section 113.1 of Title 41 of the Oklahoma Statutes:
- 1. "Physically or mentally handicapped person" means any person who has a physical impairment which severely and permanently restricts mobility of two or more extremities, or who is so severely disabled as to be unable to move without the aid of a wheelchair as defined by Title 42, Chapter 126, of the United States Code, otherwise known as the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) or any subsequent versions of the law or regulations; and
 - 2. "Service dog animal" means any dog animal individually trained to the physically or mentally handicapped person's requirements; and
 - 3. "Signal dog" means any dog trained to alert a deaf or hardof-hearing person to intruders or sounds as defined by the ADA.
- 21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.

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
