| 17 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: |
| 18 | The purpose of this act is to provide continuing occupational |
| 19 | opportunities for active duty service members or prior active duty |
| 20 | service members within one (1) year of honorable discharge by |
| 21 | offering reciprocity for professional licenses. |
| 22 | As used in this act: |
| 23 | 1. "Active duty service member" means full-time duty status in |
| 24 | the active uniformed service of the United States, including members |

of the National Guard and Reserve on active duty orders pursuant to U.S.C., Sections 1209 and 1211;

- 2. "Professional license" means any license issued pursuant to Titles 59, 63 and 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
- 3. "Licensing authority" means a department or agency within the state which is authorized by law to issue or approve licenses.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 48.4 of Title 72, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. A licensing authority shall issue a professional license to an applicant who is or was an active duty service member, upon application, in a manner prescribed by the licensing authority. An application must include proof that:
 - 1. The applicant is an active duty service member or was an active duty service member within one (1) year of honorable discharge. An applicant who was an active duty service member must have received an honorable discharge upon separation or discharge from the Armed Forces of the United States;
 - 2. The applicant holds a valid license for the profession issued by another state or the District of Columbia; and
 - 3. The license for the profession issued by another state or the District of Columbia is current and in good standing.
 - B. The licensing authority shall waive the applicant's initial license application fee.
