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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1230 of Title 36, unless there
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. As used in this section:
17	1. "Health care facility" means any public or private
18	organization, corporation, authority, partnership, sole
19	proprietorship, association, agency, network, joint venture, or
20	other entity that is involved in providing health care services,
21	including a hospital, clinic, medical center, ambulatory surgical
22	center, private physician's office, pharmacy, nursing home,
23	university hospital, medical school, nursing school, medical
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training facility, inpatient health care facility or other place where health care services are provided;

- 2. "Health care services" means any services provided by a health care provider, or by an individual working for or under the supervision of a health care provider, that relate to the diagnosis, assessment, prevention, treatment or care of any human illness, disease, injury or medical condition; and
- 3. "Medical billing company" means a company that provides medical billing services, including, but not limited to, regular invoicing, insurance verification, collections assistance, referral coordination and reimbursement tracking, on a contractual basis for a health care facility.
- B. A health care facility that contracts with a medical billing company shall provide to every person receiving health care services at the facility a written disclosure with the following information:
- Notification that the health care facility contracts with a medical billing company;
- 2. The name of the medical billing company providing medical billing services;
  - 3. Notification that the medical billing company may contact and bill the recipient of the health care services directly for additional charges;
- 4. The manner in which the medical billing company may contact the recipient of the health care services; and

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5. A good-faith estimate of any potential additional charges.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
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
