Places a notice on the motor vehicle windshield with the 4 officer's contact information, the reason the entry was made and the 5 location of the animal; 6 4. Sends the animal to an animal shelter or remains with the 7 animal in a safe location, out of the elements but reasonably close 8 to the motor vehicle; and 9 5. Uses no more force to enter the motor vehicle and remove the 10 animal from the motor vehicle than is necessary under the 11 circumstances. 12 SECTION 2.
