6	do so within sixty (60) days the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court
7	shall appoint one (1) of the nominees, the subject to confirmation
8	by a majority vote of the Speaker of the House of Representatives,

10	of the House of Representatives and the Senate, the Minority Leaders

This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It abolishes the Judicial Nominating Commission. This Commission reviews nominations to the Supreme Court, Court of Criminal Appeals and other appellate courts and then sends nominations to the The Governor selects one of the nominations to fill a vacancy on the court. Under this measure, the Governor would appoint a successor to the court without having to go through any nominating process. The appointment would have to be confirmed by majority and minority leadership of both houses of the Legislature and the Lieutenant Governor. The measure would authorize the Legislature to make modifications or alternatives to the confirmation process by law. SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED?
