7	An Act relating to attorneys; amending 5 O.S. 2001,
8	Section 18, which relates to inactive status; making payment of certain dues voluntary; removing certain

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 5 O.S. 2001, Section 18, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 18. A. The requirement for payment of annual dues
16	pursuant to Section 1 of Article VIII of the Oklahoma Bar
17	Association Rules shall be voluntary. Any payment of such dues
18	shall be made solely at the discretion of a person who has been
19	admitted to practice as an attorney in this state.
20	A. B. Any person who has been admitted to practice as an
21	attorney in this state, who is a member in good standing of the bar
22	of this state, and who meets all requirements for licensure in this
23	state may apply for status as an inactive member of the bar.
24	B. C. The application for such status shall contain:

1 1. The person's <u>attorney's</u> name, bar number, residence address,
2 telephone number or numbers where he <u>or she</u> can be reached;

A statement that he the attorney understands that, while on
such status, he or she may not do anything which constitutes the
practice of law while in this state;

A statement that he the attorney has notified all of his or her clients in this state that he or she is no longer practicing in this state; and

10 5. An affidavit that the information given is true and correct. 11 C. D. Immediately upon receipt of the application, the Supreme 12 Court or its designee shall acknowledge the application and enter 13 the person's name on a roll of inactive attorneys.

¹⁴ D. E. While on inactive status, an attorney shall not be ¹⁵ required to complete any continuing legal education requirements and ¹⁶ shall be required to pay only twenty percent (20%) of the annual ¹⁷ dues of an active member.

¹⁸ E. F. While on inactive status, an attorney shall not receive ¹⁹ the Oklahoma Bar Journal or any other services from the Oklahoma Bar ²⁰ Association except upon such terms and conditions, including payment ²¹ of charges and fees, as shall be established by the Association.

22 F. G. Once on inactive status, an attorney may reactivate his 23 or her license to practice upon payment of the equivalent of one

1	year's annual dues to the Association and upon successful completion
2	of one year's mandatory continuing legal education requirement.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
