SENATE BILL 1887

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to health insurance; requiring Insurance Department to conduct feasibility study on covering certain screenings; defining terms; requiring submission of report on study findings; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.25 of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Subject to available funding, the Insurance Department shall study the feasibility of requiring health benefit plans to provide coverage for screenings on adverse childhood experiences, as defined by the Centers for Disease Control and Population, and positive childhood experiences. The study may include, but shall not be limited to:

1. A cost-benefit analysis of coverage of one annual screening for covered children and one lifetime screening for covered adults;

1 2. Training requirements or other qualifications for providers
2 who administer the screening; and

3 3. Standards and criteria for the screening.

4 B. For purposes of this section, health benefit plan shall be
5 defined pursuant to subsection C of Section 6060.4 of Title 36 of
6 the Oklahoma Statutes.

7 C. The Department shall submit the findings of the study in a
8 report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of
9 the House of Representatives and the Governor no later than six (6)
10 months following the conclusion of the study.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.

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
