AMENDATORY 15 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2018 (59 O.S. Supp. 16 2018, Section 353.1), is amended to read as follows: 17 Section 353.1. For the purposes of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act: 18 "Accredited program" means those seminars, classes, 1. 19 meetings, work projects, and other educational courses approved by 20 the Board for purposes of continuing professional education; 21 2. "Act" means the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act; 22 3. "Administer" means the direct application of a drug, whether 23 by injection, inhalation, ingestion or any other means, to the body 24 of a patient;

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4. "Assistant pharmacist" means any person presently licensed
as an assistant pharmacist in the State of Oklahoma by the Board
pursuant to Section 353.10 of this title and for the purposes of the
Oklahoma Pharmacy Act shall be considered the same as a pharmacist,
except where otherwise specified;

6 5. "Board" or "State Board" means the State Board of Pharmacy; 7 6. "Certify" or "certification of a prescription" means the 8 review of a filled prescription by a licensed pharmacist or a 9 licensed practitioner with dispensing authority to confirm that the 10 medication, labeling and packaging of the filled prescription are 11 accurate and meet all requirements prescribed by state and federal 12 law. For the purposes of this paragraph, "licensed practitioner" 13 shall not include optometrists with dispensing authority;

¹⁴ 7. "Chemical" means any medicinal substance, whether simple or ¹⁵ compound or obtained through the process of the science and art of ¹⁶ chemistry, whether of organic or inorganic origin;

¹⁷ 8. "Compounding" means the combining, admixing, mixing, ¹⁸ diluting, pooling, reconstituting or otherwise altering of a drug or ¹⁹ bulk drug substance to create a drug. Compounding includes the ²⁰ preparation of drugs or devices in anticipation of prescription drug ²¹ orders based on routine, regularly observed prescribing patterns;

9. "Continuing professional education" means professional, pharmaceutical education in the general areas of the socioeconomic and legal aspects of health care; the properties and actions of

1 drugs and dosage forms; and the etiology, characteristics and 2 therapeutics of the diseased state;

³ 10. "Dangerous drug", "legend drug", "prescription drug" or "Rx ⁴ Only" means a drug:

a. for human use subject to 21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1), or
b. is labeled "Prescription Only", or labeled with the
following statement: "Caution: Federal law restricts
this drug except for use by or on the order of a
licensed veterinarian".

10 11. "Director" means the Executive Director of the State Board 11 of Pharmacy unless context clearly indicates otherwise; 12 12. "Dispense" or "dispensing" means the interpretation, 13 evaluation, and implementation of a prescription drug order, 14 including the preparation and delivery of a drug or device to a 15 patient or a patient's agent in a suitable container appropriately.

¹⁵ patient or a patient's agent in a suitable container appropriately ¹⁶ labeled for subsequent administration to, or use by, a patient. ¹⁷ Dispense includes sell, distribute, leave with, give away, dispose ¹⁸ of, deliver or supply;

19 13. "Dispenser" means a retail pharmacy, hospital pharmacy, a 20 group of chain pharmacies under common ownership and control that do 21 not act as a wholesale distributor, or any other person authorized 22 by law to dispense or administer prescription drugs, and the 23 affiliated warehouses or distributions of such entities under common 24 ownership and control that do not act as a wholesale distributor.

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For the purposes of this paragraph, "dispenser" does not mean a person who dispenses only products to be used in animals in accordance with 21 U.S.C. 360b(a)(5);

4 14. "Distribute" or "distribution" means the sale, purchase, 5 trade, delivery, handling, storage, or receipt of a product, and 6 does not include the dispensing of a product pursuant to a 7 prescription executed in accordance with 21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1) or the 8 dispensing of a product approved under 21 U.S.C. 360b(b); provided, 9 taking actual physical possession of a product or title shall not be 10 required;

11 15. "Doctor of Pharmacy" means a person licensed by the Board 12 to engage in the practice of pharmacy. The terms "pharmacist", 13 "D.Ph.", and "Doctor of Pharmacy" shall be interchangeable and shall 14 have the same meaning wherever they appear in the Oklahoma Statutes 15 and the rules promulgated by the Board;

16 16. "Drug outlet" means all manufacturers, repackagers, 17 outsourcing facilities, wholesale distributors, third-party 18 logistics providers, pharmacies, and all other facilities which are 19 engaged in dispensing, delivery, distribution or storage of 20 dangerous drugs;

21 17. "Drugs" means all medicinal substances and preparations 22 recognized by the United States Pharmacopoeia and National 23 Formulary, or any revision thereof, and all substances and 24 preparations intended for external and/or internal use in the cure,

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¹ diagnosis, mitigation, treatment or prevention of disease in humans ² or animals and all substances and preparations, other than food, ³ intended to affect the structure or any function of the body of a ⁴ human or animals;

⁵ 18. "Drug sample" means a unit of a prescription drug packaged ⁶ under the authority and responsibility of the manufacturer that is ⁷ not intended to be sold and is intended to promote the sale of the ⁸ drug;

9 19. "Filled prescription" means a packaged prescription 10 medication to which a label has been affixed which contains such 11 information as is required by the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act;

12 20. "Hospital" means any institution licensed as a hospital by 13 this state for the care and treatment of patients, or a pharmacy 14 operated by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs;

¹⁵ 21. "Licensed practitioner" means an allopathic physician, ¹⁶ osteopathic physician, podiatric physician, dentist, veterinarian<u>,</u> ¹⁷ or optometrist or Advanced Practice Registered Nurse licensed to ¹⁸ practice and authorized to prescribe dangerous drugs within the ¹⁹ scope of practice of such practitioner;

20 22. "Manufacturer" or "virtual manufacturer" means with respect 21 to a product:

a. a person that holds an application approved under 21
 U.S.C. 355 or a license issued under 42 U.S.C. 262 for
 such product, or if such product is not the subject of

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- an approved application or license, the person who manufactured the product,
- b. a co-licensed partner of the person described in
 subparagraph a that obtains the product directly from
 a person described in this subparagraph or
 subparagraph a,
- 7 c. an affiliate of a person described in subparagraph a 8 or b who receives the product directly from a person 9 described in this subparagraph or in subparagraph a or 10 b; or
- 11 d. a person who contracts with another to manufacture a 12 product;

13 23. "Manufacturing" means the production, preparation, 14 propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of a device or a 15 drug, either directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of 16 natural origin or independently by means of chemical or biological 17 synthesis and includes any packaging or repackaging of the 18 substances or labeling or relabeling of its container, and the 19 promotion and marketing of such drugs or devices. The term 20 "manufacturing" also includes the preparation and promotion of 21 commercially available products from bulk compounds for resale by 22 licensed pharmacies, licensed practitioners or other persons; 23

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1 24. "Medical gas" means those gases including those in liquid 2 state upon which the manufacturer or distributor has placed one of 3 several cautions, such as "Rx Only", in compliance with federal law; 4 25. "Medical gas order" means an order for medical gas issued 5 by a licensed prescriber;

6 26. "Medical gas distributor" means a person licensed to 7 distribute, transfer, wholesale, deliver or sell medical gases on 8 drug orders to suppliers or other entities licensed to use, 9 administer or distribute medical gas and may also include a patient 10 or ultimate user;

¹¹ 27. "Medical gas supplier" means a person who dispenses medical ¹² gases on drug orders only to a patient or ultimate user;

¹³ 28. "Medicine" means any drug or combination of drugs which has ¹⁴ the property of curing, preventing, treating, diagnosing or ¹⁵ mitigating diseases, or which is used for that purpose;

16 29. "Nonprescription drugs" means medicines or drugs which are 17 sold without a prescription and which are prepackaged for use by the 18 consumer and labeled in accordance with the requirements of the 19 statutes and regulations of this state and the federal government. 20 Such items shall also include medical and dental supplies and 21 bottled or nonbulk chemicals which are sold or offered for sale to 22 the general public if such articles or preparations meet the 23 requirements of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, 21 24 U.S.C.A., Section 321 et seq.; _ _

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¹ 30. "Outsourcing facility", including "virtual outsourcing ² facility" means a facility at one geographic location or address ³ that:

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a. is engaged in the compounding of sterile drugs,b. has elected to register as an outsourcing facility,and

7 complies with all requirements of 21 U.S.C. 353b; с. 8 31. "Package" means the smallest individual saleable unit of 9 product for distribution by a manufacturer or repackager that is 10 intended by the manufacturer for ultimate sale to the dispenser of 11 such product. For the purposes of this paragraph, "individual 12 saleable unit" means the smallest container of a product introduced 13 into commerce by the manufacturer or repackager that is intended by 14 the manufacturer or repackager for individual sale to a dispenser;

15 32. "Person" means an individual, partnership, limited 16 liability company, corporation or association, unless the context 17 otherwise requires;

18 33. "Pharmacist-in-charge" or "PIC" means the pharmacist
19 licensed in this state responsible for the management control of a
20 pharmacy and all other aspects of the practice of pharmacy in a
21 licensed pharmacy as defined by Section 353.18 of this title;

34. "Pharmacy" means a place regularly licensed by the Board of Pharmacy in which prescriptions, drugs, medicines, chemicals and poisons are compounded or dispensed or such place where pharmacists practice the profession of pharmacy, or a pharmacy operated by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs;

3 35. "Pharmacy technician", "technician", "Rx tech", or "tech" means a person issued a Technician permit by the State Board of Pharmacy to assist the pharmacist and perform nonjudgmental, technical, manipulative, non-discretionary functions in the prescription department under the immediate and direct supervision of a pharmacist;

9 36. "Poison" means any substance which when introduced into the 10 body, either directly or by absorption, produces violent, morbid or 11 fatal changes, or which destroys living tissue with which such 12 substance comes into contact;

13 37. "Practice of pharmacy" means:

- a. the interpretation and evaluation of prescription
 orders,
- b. the compounding, dispensing, administering and
 labeling of drugs and devices, except labeling by a
 manufacturer, repackager or distributor of
 nonprescription drugs and commercially packaged legend
 drugs and devices,
- c. the participation in drug selection and drug
 utilization reviews,
- d. the proper and safe storage of drugs and devices and
 the maintenance of proper records thereof,

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e. the responsibility for advising by counseling and providing information, where professionally necessary or where regulated, of therapeutic values, content, hazards and use of drugs and devices,

5 f. the offering or performing of those acts, services, 6 operations or transactions necessary in the conduct, 7 operation, management and control of a pharmacy, or 8 g. the provision of those acts or services that are

necessary to provide pharmaceutical care;

¹⁰ 38. "Preparation" means an article which may or may not contain ¹¹ sterile products compounded in a licensed pharmacy pursuant to the ¹² order of a licensed prescriber;

¹³ 39. "Prescriber" means a person licensed in this state who is ¹⁴ authorized to prescribe dangerous drugs within the scope of practice ¹⁵ of the person's profession;

¹⁶ 40. "Prescription" means and includes any order for drug or ¹⁷ medical supplies written or signed, or transmitted by word of mouth, ¹⁸ telephone or other means of communication:

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a. by a licensed prescriber,

b. <u>by an Oklahoma licensed physician assistant</u> under the
 supervision of an Oklahoma licensed practitioner
 <u>physician</u>, an Oklahoma licensed advanced practice

13	41. "Product" means a prescription drug in a finished dosage
14	form for administration to a patient without substantial further
15	manufacturing, such as capsules, tablets, and lyophilized products
16	before reconstitution. "Product" does not include blood components
17	intended for transfusion, radioactive drugs or biologics and medical
18	gas;
19	42. "Repackager", including "virtual repackager", means a
20	person who owns or operates an establishment that repacks and
21	relabels a product or package for further sale or distribution
22	without further transaction;
23	12 "Storilo drug" moone a drug that is intended for parenteral

43. "Sterile drug" means a drug that is intended for parenteral administration, an ophthalmic or oral inhalation drug in aqueous

1 format, or a drug that is required to be sterile under state and 2 federal law;

44. "Supervising physician" means an individual holding a
 current license to practice as a physician from the State Board of
 Medical Licensure and Supervision, pursuant to the provisions of the
 Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision
 Act, or the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, pursuant to the
 provisions of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, who supervises
 an advanced practice registered nurse:

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¹ 45. "Supportive personnel" means technicians and auxiliary ² supportive persons who are regularly paid employees of a pharmacy ³ who work and perform tasks in the pharmacy as authorized by Section ⁴ 353.18A of this title;

5 46. "Third-party logistics provider", including "virtual third-6 party logistics provider" means an entity that provides or 7 coordinates warehousing, or other logistics services of a product in 8 interstate commerce on behalf of a manufacturer, wholesale 9 distributor, or dispenser of a product but does not take ownership 10 of the product, nor have responsibility to direct the sale or 11 disposition of the product. For the purposes of this paragraph, 12 "third-party logistics provider" does not include shippers and the 13 United States Postal Service;

14 47. "Wholesale distributor", including "virtual wholesale 15 distributor" means a person other than a manufacturer, a 16 manufacturer's co-licensed partner, a third-party logistics 17 provider, or repackager engaged in wholesale distribution as defined 18 by 21 U.S.C. 353(e)(4) as amended by the Drug Supply Chain Security 19 Act;

20 48. "County jail" means a facility operated by a county for the 21 physical detention and correction of persons charged with, or 22 convicted of, criminal offenses or ordinance violations or persons 23 found guilty of civil or criminal contempt;

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¹ 49. "State correctional facility" means a facility or ² institution that houses a prisoner population under the jurisdiction ³ of the Department of Corrections;

⁴ 50. "Unit dose package" means a package that contains a single ⁵ dose drug with the name, strength, control number, and expiration ⁶ date of that drug on the label; and

⁷ 51. "Unit of issue package" means a package that provides
⁸ multiple doses of the same drug, but each drug is individually
⁹ separated and includes the name, lot number, and expiration date.

Section 353.1a. A. Prescribing authority shall be allowed, under for Certified Nurse Practitioners who have obtained a waiver of supervision from the State Board of Nursing and:

16 1. Under the medical direction of a supervising physician, for 17 an advanced practice nurse recognized by the Oklahoma Board of 18 Nursing in one of the following categories: advanced registered 19 nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, or certified nurse-20 midwives Clinical Nurse Specialists and Certified Nurse-Midwives; 21 2. For Certified Nurse Practitioners who choose to practice 22 under the medical direction of a supervising physician; and 23 3. For Certified Nurse Practitioners who are undergoing a 24 mentorship pursuant to Section 8 of this act.

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1 The advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse 2 may write or sign, or transmit by word of mouth, telephone or other 3 means of communication an order for drugs or medical supplies that 4 is intended to be filled, compounded, or dispensed by a pharmacist. 5 The supervising physician and the advanced practice nurse Advanced 6 Practice Registered Nurse shall be identified at the time of 7 origination of the prescription and the name of the advanced 8 practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall be printed 9 on the prescription label.

B. Pharmacists may dispense prescriptions for non-controlled prescription drugs authorized by an advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse or physician assistant, not located in Oklahoma, provided that they are licensed in the state in which they are actively prescribing.

15 Pharmacists may only dispense prescriptions for controlled С. 16 dangerous substances prescribed by an advanced practice nurse 17 Advanced Practice Registered Nurse or a physician assistant licensed 18 in the State of Oklahoma and supervised by an Oklahoma-licensed 19 practitioner. Pharmacists may only dispense prescriptions for 20 controlled dangerous substances prescribed by an Advanced Practice 21 Registered Nurse licensed and located in the State of Oklahoma. 22 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.3a, as SECTION 3. 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Section 567.3a. As used in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act: 1. "Board" means the Oklahoma Board of Nursing;

"The practice of nursing" means the performance of services 4 provided for purposes of nursing diagnosis and treatment of human 5 responses to actual or potential health problems consistent with 6 educational preparation. Knowledge and skill are the basis for 7 assessment, analysis, planning, intervention, and evaluation used in 8 the promotion and maintenance of health and nursing management of 9 illness, injury, infirmity, restoration or optimal function, or 10 death with dignity. Practice is based on understanding the human 11 condition across the human lifespan and understanding the 12 relationship of the individual within the environment. This 13 practice includes execution of the medical regime including the 14 administration of medications and treatments prescribed by any 15 person authorized by state law to so prescribe; 16

¹⁶ 3. "Registered nursing" means the practice of the full scope of ¹⁷ nursing which includes, but is not limited to:

 recognized by the Board that measures the advanced
 practice registered nurse role and specialty
 competencies and who maintains recertification in the
 role and specialty through a national certification
 program,
- 11 c. who has acquired advanced clinical knowledge and 12 skills in preparation for providing both direct and 13 indirect care to patients; however, the defining 14 factor for all Advanced Practice Registered Nurses is 15 that a significant component of the education and 16 practice focuses on direct care of individuals,
- 17d. whose practice builds on the competencies of18Registered Nurses by demonstrating a greater depth and19breadth of knowledge, a greater synthesis of data, and20increased complexity of skills and interventions, and
- e. who has been educationally prepared to assume

16 2. Hold current Registered Nurse and Advanced Practice 17 Registered Nurse licenses (APRN-CNP, APRN-CNS, or APRN-CNM) in the 18 state;

19 3. Hold current licensure or recognition as an Advanced 20 Practice Registered Nurse in the same role and specialty with 21 prescribing privileges in another state or territory;

4. Submit documentation verifying successful completion of a
 graduate level advanced practice registered nursing education
 program that included an academic course in pharmacotherapeutic

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¹ management, and didactic and clinical preparation for prescribing ² incorporated throughout the program;

³ 5. Submit a written statement from an Oklahoma licensed ⁴ physician supervising prescriptive authority as required by the ⁵ Board in its rules;

6 6. Meet continued competency requirements as set forth in Board 7 rules; and

8 7. Provide any and all other evidence as required by the Board
9 in its rules.

E. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse license issued under this section shall be renewed concurrently with the registered nurse license provided that qualifying criteria continue to be met.

F. The Board may reinstate a license as set forth in Board rules.

SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.7, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 190, O.S.L. 2016 (59 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 567.7), is amended to read as follows:

Section 567.7. A. Upon expiration of an initial license or certificate issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act, a license or certificate shall be renewed every two (2) years according to a schedule published by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing, provided that the application is complete and qualifying criteria continues to be met.

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B. A licensee or certificate holder who applies for
 reinstatement of a license or certificate shall meet such
 requirements as the Board may prescribe in its rules.

4 С. Any licensee or certificate holder who desires to retire 5 temporarily from the practice of nursing in this state shall submit 6 a written request to that effect to the Board. The Board may reduce the 7 biennial renewal fees on a pro rata basis for the specific 8 Registered Nurse and Licensed Practical Nurse biennial renewal 9 Notwithstanding any other provision of law in this section, period. 10 the renewal fee for Certified Nurse Practitioners who have obtained 11 a waiver of supervision from the State Board of Nursing and practice 12 unsupervised shall be an amount equivalent to the renewal fee 13 imposed on osteopathic physicians.

14 Ε. The Executive Director of the Board shall suspend the 15 license or certificate of a person who submits a check, money draft, 16 or similar instrument for payment of a fee which is not honored by 17 the financial institution named. The suspension becomes effective 18 ten (10) days following delivery by certified mail of written notice 19 of the dishonor and the impending suspension to the person's address 20 on file. Upon notification of suspension, the person may reinstate 21 the authorization to practice upon payment of the fees and any and 22 all costs associated with notice and collection. The suspension 23 shall be exempt from the Administrative Procedures Act.

A veterinarian who has complied with the registration requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in the course of the professional practice of the veterinarian only, and not for use by a human being, may prescribe, administer, and dispense controlled dangerous substances and may cause them to be administered by an assistant or orderly under the direction and supervision of the veterinarian.
