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2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

3 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
4 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

5 A. There is hereby created to continue until December 31, 2022,  
6 the "Out-of-Schooltime Task Force". The purpose of the task force  
7 shall be to identify, evaluate and recommend a set of best practices  
8 for children, youth and families which will improve and increase the  
9 number of quality, affordable out-of-school programs in the state.

10 B. The task force shall be comprised of nineteen (19) members  
11 as follows:

12 1. One current member of the House of Representatives,  
13 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

14 2. One current member of the Senate, appointed by the President  
15 Pro Tempore of the Senate;

16 3. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction or designee;

17 4. The Director of the Department of Human Services or  
18 designee;

19 5. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and  
20 Substance Abuse Services or designee;

21 6. The Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs or  
22 designee;

23 7. The Commissioner of the State Department of designee;

1        8. One member who is a school administrator, appointed by the  
2 State Superintendent of Public Instruction;

3        9. One member who is a certified teacher, appointed by the  
4 State Superintendent of Public Instruction;

5        10. One member who is a representative of a tribal nation,  
6 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

7        11. One member who is a representative of a national nonprofit  
8 organization made up of local chapters which provide youth  
9 development programming during out-of-schooltime hours to children  
10 six (6) to eighteen (18) years of age at a minimum of seventy-five  
11 sites statewide and aggregate statewide outcomes data via a national  
12 survey, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

13       12. One member who is a representative of a national nonprofit  
14 organization for youth development, healthy living and social  
15 responsibility, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
16 Senate;

17       13. One member who is a representative of a nonprofit statewide  
18 after-school network, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
19 Senate;

20       14. One member who is a representative of the Governor's  
21 office, appointed by the Governor;

22       15. Three members who represent out-of-schooltime service  
23 providers from different geographic areas of the state, one of which  
24 shall be a for-profit licensed child care provider actively

1 providing out-of-schooltime services in the state, appointed by the  
2 Governor; and

3 16. Two members who represent higher education, one from a  
4 public research university and one from a public regional  
5 university, appointed by the Governor.

6 C. Appointments to the task force shall be made by December 1,  
7 2021. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction shall call the  
8 first meeting of the task force which shall be held no later than  
9 February 1, 2022. Members of the task force shall serve at the  
10 pleasure of the appointing authority. A vacancy on the task force  
11 shall be filled by the appointing authority.

12 D. The task force shall elect a chair and vice chair at its  
13 first meeting. For purposes of this task force, ten (10) members of  
14 the task force present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum to  
15 conduct business.

16 E. The task force shall convene at least six meetings and be  
17 authorized to meet at such times as may be required in order to  
18 fulfill the duties imposed upon the task force by law. Members of  
19 the task force shall not receive compensation and shall not be  
20 reimbursed for travel expenses.

21 F. The task force shall:

22 1. Review existing maps of after-school programs and highlight  
23 gaps in access and equity including equity for Oklahomans with  
24 disabilities;

2. Engage with and solicit feedback from:

- a. faculty at institutes of higher education,
- b. community practitioners,
- c. recognized professional associations, and
- d. the public;

3. Identify and evaluate a set of evidence-based, evidence-informed and promising best practices to improve and increase the number of quality, affordable out-of-school programs in the state;

4. Review tools to evaluate success across education, health, substance abuse prevention and workforce readiness outcomes;

5. Recommend these best practices and evaluation tools including disseminating information to:

- a. the State Department of Health, Department of Human Services, State Department of Education, Office of the Attorney General and other agencies, as appropriate,
- b. state, tribal and local government agencies including their educational agencies,
- c. other entities identified by the task force, and
- d. the general public; and

6. Explore funding sources to support out of schooltime.

G. Administrative support for the task force shall be provided by the House of Representatives.

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H. The task force shall issue a report of its findings to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than December 1, 2022.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021."

24 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be

9 13. One member who is a representative of a nonprofit statewide  
10 after-school network, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
11 Oklahoma State Senate;

12 14. One member who is a representative of the Governor's  
13 office, appointed by the Governor;

14 15. Three members who represent out-of-schooltime service  
15 providers from different geographic areas of the state, one of which  
16 shall be a for-profit licensed child care provider actively  
17 providing out-of-schooltime services in the state, appointed by the  
18 Governor; and

19 16. Two members who represent higher education, one from a  
20 public research university and one from a public regional  
21 university, appointed by the Governor.

22 C. Appointments to the task force shall be made by December 1,  
23 2021. Members of the task force shall serve at the pleasure of the

1 appointing authority. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled  
2 by the appointing authority.

3 D. The task force shall elect a chair and vice-chair at its  
4 first meeting. A majority of the members present at a meeting shall  
5 constitute a quorum to conduct business.

6 E. The task force shall convene at least six meetings and be  
7 authorized to meet at such times as may be required in order to  
8 fulfill the duties imposed upon the task force by law. Members of  
9 the task force shall not be reimbursed for travel expenses.

10 F. The task force shall:

11 1. Review existing maps of after-school programs and highlight  
12 gaps in access and equity, including equity for Oklahomans with  
13 disabilities;

14 2. Engage with and solicit feedback from:

- 15 a. faculty at institutes of higher learning,
- 16 b. community practitioners,

10        6. Explore funding sources to support out of schooltime.

11        G. The task force shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting  
12 Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

13        H. Staff assistance for the task force shall be provided by the  
14 state-based affiliate of the national nonprofit organization  
15 representative appointed pursuant to paragraph 11 of subsection B of  
16 this section.

17        I. The task force shall issue a report of its findings to the  
18 Oklahoma Legislature and Governor no later than December 1, 2022.

19        SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
