6 4. ~~The past president of Oklahoma Community-Based Providers or~~
7 ~~designee to serve for a one-year period, who may be reappointed by~~
8 ~~the succeeding president~~ One member who shall be a state use
9 provider who shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
10 Senate;

11 5. An individual or a parent or guardian of an individual with
12 ~~severe~~ significant disabilities who participates in vocational
13 programming through a ~~sheltered environment facility~~ qualified
14 nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities, to be ~~selected~~
15 ~~by the Committee~~ appointed by the Speaker of the House of
16 Representatives;

17 6. The Director of Human Services, or designee; and

18 7. ~~A certified procurement officer from any state agency~~
19 ~~appointed by the State Purchasing Director, selected to represent~~
20 ~~the customer agencies of the State of Oklahoma; and~~

21 8. ~~As a nonvoting member, a~~ A person employed by the Office of
22 Management and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division as a
23 contracting officer ~~in the purchasing division~~, appointed by the
24 State Purchasing Director ~~with the advice of the Committee and~~

1 ~~designated specifically to solicit, develop, and negotiate contracts~~

6 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3003, is
7 amended to read as follows:

8 Section 3003. As used in ~~this act~~ Section 3001 et seq. of this
9 title:

10 1. "Blind person" means a person having a visual acuity not to
11 exceed 20/200 in the better eye, with correcting lenses, or visual
12 acuity greater than 20/200 but with limitation in the field of
13 vision such that the widest diameter of visual field subtends an
14 angle no greater than twenty (20) degrees;

15 2. "~~Committee~~ Council" means the State Use ~~Committee~~ Advisory
16 Council;

17 3. "Qualified nonprofit agency for the ~~severely handicapped~~
18 employment of people with significant disabilities" means a
19 nonprofit agency÷

20 a. employing ~~severely disabled~~ persons with significant
21 disabilities who constitute at least seventy-five
22 percent (75%) of the ~~personnel~~ direct labor hours
23 engaged in direct production, manufacturing,
24 processing and/or assembling of products or services

1 offered by the agency for procurement by this state
2 ~~and or~~ who meet the definition of "~~blind person~~" blind
3 person as provided for in paragraph 1 of this section,
4 or

5 ~~b.~~ which is certified as a sheltered workshop by the Wage
6 and Hour Division of the United States Department of
7 Labor;

8 4. "~~Severely disabled person~~" "Person with significant
9 disabilities" means an individual with a physical or mental
10 disability constituting a substantial handicap to employment and
11 preventing the person from engaging in normal competitive employment
12 and/or includes any blind person;

13 5. "Qualified organization" means a blind person, ~~or~~ or qualified
14 nonprofit agency for the ~~severely handicapped, or severely disabled~~
15 ~~person~~ employment of people with significant disabilities
16 contracting to supply goods or services;

17 6. "Manufactured" means goods made by manual labor;

18 7. "Produced" means to have brought into existence or created
19 from raw materials;

20 8. "Processed" means the action of taking something through an
21 established and mostly routine set of procedures or steps to
22 substantially convert a potential product from one form to another.
23 This action involves a sequence of multiple steps each requiring a
24

1 distinct decision-making process to evolve a potential product to
2 the next step; ~~and~~

3 9. "Assemble" means to put or fit together or put together the
4 parts of a potential product;

5 10. "Central nonprofit agency (CNA)" means a qualified 501(c)3
6 nonprofit entity meeting the qualifications in the Request for
7 Procurement (RFP) issued by the Office of Management and Enterprise
8 Services selected to administer and oversee the State Use Program;
9 and

10 11. "Procurement schedule" means a designated schedule of
11 products and services currently approved by the Office of Management
12 and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division as suitable to
13 procure from qualified organizations participating in the State Use
14 Program.

15 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3004, is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section 3004. The ~~Committee~~ Office of Management and Enterprise
18 Services Central Purchasing Division shall designate and distribute
19 by regulation a schedule, hereinafter referred to as the procurement
20 schedule, of the products directly manufactured, produced, processed
21 or assembled or services directly performed, offered or provided by
22 any ~~severely disabled~~ person with significant disabilities or
23 qualified nonprofit agency for the ~~severely disabled~~ employment of
24 people with significant disabilities, as defined by this act in

1 Section 3003 of this title, which the ~~Committee~~ State Purchasing
2 Director determines are suitable for procurement by the state. No
3 ~~state agency shall purchase, pursuant to Section 3007 of this title,~~
4 ~~products or services purporting to be made by severely disabled~~
5 ~~persons in workshops which are not certified by the Committee or by~~
6 ~~severely disabled individuals who are not certified by the Committee~~
7 The products and services on contract will be published on the
8 procurement schedule and will be designated as mandatory. The
9 Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing
10 Division shall have the authority to qualify organizations for
11 inclusion in the State Use Program, monitor qualified organizations
12 for continued compliance to remain active in the program, and remove
13 organizations from the program. Central Purchasing shall have the
14 authority to award and manage contracts to the qualified
15 organizations as well as to renegotiate or cancel contracts when
16 appropriate.

19 Section 3004.1 ~~A one-percent fee of any contract for products~~

23 organization as defined in Section 3003 of this title and assess a
24 contract management fee or levy. The contract management fee or

1 levy shall be deposited in the State Use ~~Committee~~ Advisory Council
2 Revolving Fund, as created in Section 3004.2 of this title, for the
3 salary, administrative costs, annual trainings, professional
4 association memberships, qualified agency operational improvement
5 grants, periodic economic advantage study, Annual Report
6 development, and other expenses incurred by the Central Purchasing
7 Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
8 promoting goods and services provided by qualified organizations.

19 title. The fund shall be invested in any of the types of
20 instruments in which the State Treasurer is authorized by law to

23 be budgeted and expended by the Office of Management and Enterprise
24 Services for the salary and other administrative expenses of the

1 buyer and clerical and technical support in the Central Purchasing
2 Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services
3 responsible for contracts for the products and services of ~~the~~
4 ~~severely disabled~~ people with significant disabilities and expenses
5 the Office incurs to support ~~Committee~~ State Use operations
6 including services of the Centralized Non-Profit Agency (CNA).
7 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the
8 State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the
9 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
10 approval and payment.

18 any of its agencies intends to procure any product or service
19 included in the procurement schedule, that entity shall secure the
20 product or service from a qualified nonprofit agency providing
21 employment to people with ~~severe~~ significant disabilities at the
22 fair market price determined by the ~~Committee~~ Office of Management
23 and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division, if the product
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1 or service is available within the period required by the entity and
2 meets the specifications of the entity.

3 B. An agency of this state shall not evade the intent and
4 meaning of this section by slight variations from standards adopted
5 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
6 Purchasing Division.

7 C. Provided, the requirements of this section shall not apply
8 to the procurement of janitorial services by the Oklahoma State
9 Bureau of Investigation. The Bureau shall conduct background
10 investigations and national criminal history record checks on
11 companies and individuals with which it contracts to provide
12 janitorial services.

13 ~~D. When the fair market price for a product or service approved~~
14 ~~by the Committee exceeds a current market price for the same product~~
15 ~~or service, and such lower market price has been verified by the~~
16 ~~agency through compliance with the fair market analysis process~~
17 ~~approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, the~~
18 ~~state use contracting officer may grant a temporary exception to a~~
19 ~~requesting agency so that the agency may purchase the product or~~
20 ~~service from the vendor offering the lower market price. The~~
21 ~~temporary exception shall automatically expire when a new fair~~
22 ~~market price is established by the State Use Committee~~ Any
23 municipality or county agency of this state is authorized to
24 purchase products and services from any qualified organization as

1 defined in Section 3003 of this title. The qualified organization
2 shall be able to meet the needs and specifications for the products
3 or services required by the purchasing body at the fair market
4 price. Procurements made pursuant to the provisions of this section
5 shall not be subject to competitive bid requirements.

6 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3008, is
7 amended to read as follows:

8 Section 3008. A. Nothing in ~~Sections~~ Section 3001 et seq. of
9 this title pursuant to purchases of products and services from
10 people with ~~severe~~ significant disabilities shall be construed to
11 prohibit any department or agency of the state from manufacturing or
12 supplying its own products or services for its own use.
13 Procurements made pursuant to ~~this act~~ Section 3001 et seq. of this
14 title shall not be subject to the competitive bid requirements of
15 the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, Section 85.1 et seq. of this
16 title.

17 B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
18 Purchasing Division shall require an annual qualified organization
19 pricing review for all products and services approved and designated
20 on the procurement schedule. The method of the pricing review shall
21 be defined in the promulgated rules.

22 C. When the fair market price for a product or service approved
23 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
24 Purchasing Division exceeds a current market price for the same

1 product or service and such lower market price has been verified by
2 the agency through compliance with the fair market analysis process
3 approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
4 Purchasing Division, the State Use contracting officer may grant a
5 temporary exception to a requesting agency so that the agency may
6 purchase the product or service from the supplier offering the lower
7 market price.

8 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3009, is

~~C. The Committee shall report any violations of the intent of the laws to the Attorney General's office within thirty (30) days of their determination of such violations.~~

3. "Qualified nonprofit agency for ~~the severely handicapped employment of people with significant disabilities~~" means a nonprofit agency÷

a. employing ~~severely disabled~~ persons with significant disabilities who constitute at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the ~~personnel~~ direct labor hours engaged in direct production, manufacturing, processing and/or assembling of products or services offered by the agency for procurement by this state ~~and or~~ who meet the definition of "~~blind person~~" blind person as provided for in paragraph 1 of this section,

or

~~b.~~ which is certified as a sheltered workshop by the Wage and Hour Division of the United States Department of Labor;

4. ~~"Severely disabled person"~~ "Person with significant disabilities" means an individual with a physical or mental disability constituting a substantial handicap to employment and preventing the person from engaging in normal competitive employment and/or includes any blind person;

5. "Qualified organization" means a blind person, ~~or~~ or qualified nonprofit agency for the ~~severely handicapped, or severely disabled person~~ employment of people with significant disabilities contracting to supply goods or services;

6. "Manufactured" means goods made by manual labor;

7. "Produced" means to have brought into existence or created from raw materials;

8. "Processed" means the action of taking something through an established and mostly routine set of procedures or steps to substantially convert a potential product from one form to another. This action involves a sequence of multiple steps each requiring a distinct decision-making process to evolve a potential product to the next step; ~~and~~

9. "Assemble" means to put or fit together or put together the parts of a potential product;

1 10. "Central nonprofit agency (CNA)" means a qualified 501(c)3
2 nonprofit entity meeting the qualifications in the Request for
3 Procurement (RFP) issued by the Office of Management and Enterprise
4 Services selected to administer and oversee the State Use Program;
5 and

6 11. "Procurement schedule" means a designated schedule of
7 products and services currently approved by the Office of Management
8 and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division as suitable to
9 procure from qualified organizations participating in the State Use
10 Program.

11 SECTION 17. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3004, is
12 amended to read as follows:

9 ~~D. When the fair market price for a product or service approved~~
10 ~~by the Committee exceeds a current market price for the same product~~
11 ~~or service, and such lower market price has been verified by the~~
12 ~~agency through compliance with the fair market analysis process~~
13 ~~approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, the~~
14 ~~state use contracting officer may grant a temporary exception to a~~
15 ~~requesting agency so that the agency may purchase the product or~~

6 prohibit any department or agency of the state from manufacturing or
7 supplying its own products or services for its own use.
8 Procurements made pursuant to ~~this act~~ Section 3001 et seq. of this
9 title shall not be subject to the competitive bid requirements of
10 the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, Section 85.1 et seq. of this
11 title.

12 B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
13 Purchasing Division shall require an annual qualified organization
14 pricing review for all products and services approved and designated
15 on the procurement schedule. The method of the pricing review shall
16 be defined in the promulgated rules.

17 C. When the fair market price for a product or service approved
18 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
19 Purchasing Division exceeds a current market price for the same
20 product or service, and such lower market price has been verified by
21 the agency through compliance with the fair market analysis process
22 approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
23 Purchasing Division, the State Use contracting officer may grant a
24 temporary exception to a requesting agency so that the agency may

1 purchase the product or service from the supplier offering the lower
2 market price.

3 SECTION 24. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3009, is

21 ~~C. The Committee shall report any violations of the intent of~~
22 ~~the laws to the Attorney General's office within thirty (30) days of~~
23 ~~their determination of such violations.~~

The Committee shall file an Annual Report~~ On an annual basis, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall within sixty (60) days after the close of the legislative fiscal year, transmit a strategic plan for the State Use Program ~~with~~ to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Governor.

SECTION 25. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3010, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 26. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
