Strike the title, enacting clause, and entire bill 10 and insert: 11 12 13 "An Act relating to the Occupational Licensing Review Act; amending 40 O.S. 2021, Section 800.1, which 14 relates to the Occupational Licensing Advisory Commission; providing termination date; providing an 15 effective date; and declaring an emergency. 16 17 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 19 40 O.S. 2021, Section 800.1, is SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 20 amended to read as follows: 21 Section 800.1 There is hereby created the Occupational 22 Licensing Advisory Commission. 23 The Commission shall consist of twelve (12) members to be 24 appointed and serve as follows:

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The Commissioner of Labor shall serve coterminous with his
 or her office;

3 2. Two members of the House of Representatives shall be
4 appointed by the Majority Leader of the House of Representatives.
5 Each member shall serve an initial term of three (3) years;

6 3. One member of the House of Representatives shall be
7 appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives,
8 who shall serve an initial term of two (2) years;

9 4. Two members of the Senate shall be appointed by the Majority
10 Leader of the Senate. Each member shall serve an initial term of
11 three (3) years;

12 5. One member of the Senate shall be appointed by the Minority 13 Leader of the Senate, who shall serve an initial term of two (2) 14 years;

15 6. The Chief Information Officer of the Office of Management
16 and Enterprise Services shall serve coterminous with his or her

18 7. Three members shall be appointed by the Governor, who shall 19 represent an occupation or profession licensed in the state, and who 20 shall each serve an initial term of one year. One appointee shall 21 be a member of the medical community, which may include but is not 22 limited to a licensed physician, pharmacist or psychologist. One 23 appointee shall be a member of a trade profession, which may include 24 but is not limited to a licensed alarm or locksmith professional or

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electrician. One appointee shall be a member of the business
 community, which may include but is not limited to a licensed public
 accountant or member of the real estate industry; and

8. One member shall be appointed by the Governor who shall
represent a not-for-profit organization that advocates for lowincome persons or disadvantaged persons and who shall serve an
initial term of one year.

8 The Commission shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act 9 and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

During membership on the Commission, no appointed member shall serve on any board, agency, committee or commission that regulates or governs the occupation or profession such member is appointed to represent.

14 Members shall serve staggered three-year terms, except for the 15 initial term of office. Upon the expiration of a member's term of 16 office, such member may be reappointed. No member shall serve more 17 than two consecutive full three-year terms. Any member vacancy 18 shall be filled in the same manner by the appointing authority for 19 the unexpired term. A member may be removed by either the 20 appointing authority or a majority of the Commission members for 21 failure to attend meetings or for cause.

The Commissioner of Labor, or his or her designee, shall chair each meeting. The Department of Labor shall provide staff and administrative support to the Commission.

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Seven members shall constitute a quorum for purposes of
 conducting the business of the Commission. Meetings shall be called
 by the chair and may be held by electronic media or in any location
 deemed appropriate by the chair.

5 The purpose of the Commission is to conduct a review of each occupational or professional licensing act in this state not less 6 7 than once every four (4) years and make recommendations to the Legislature. The first meeting of the Commission shall be held 8 9 before September 30, 2018, to develop a four-year schedule showing 10 when each licensing act will be reviewed. Any new licensing act or 11 new category of license enacted by the Legislature for regulation by 12 an existing licensing board, agency or commission shall be added to 13 the four-year schedule and shall be initially reviewed within ninety 14 (90) days of enactment.

15 Annually the Commission shall hold at least one public meeting 16 to present its findings on any occupational or professional license 17 it has reviewed. At the public meeting, the Commission shall allow 18 public comments, make recommendations, and may vote whether to 19 recommend to the Legislature that such license be maintained, 20 modified, or repealed. The results of any public meeting held for 21 the purpose of making legislative recommendations shall be provided 22 in a written report to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the 23 Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives prior to the 24 legislative deadline set for requesting legislation for the upcoming

2	Department of Labor's website for public inspection.
3	The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force and
