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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 51 O.S. 2021, Section 253, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 253. A. Except as provided in subsection B of this
18	section, no governmental entity shall substantially burden a
19	person's free exercise of religion even if the burden results from a
20	rule of general applicability.
21	B. No governmental entity shall substantially burden a person's
22	free exercise of religion unless it demonstrates that application of
23	the burden to the person is:
24	1. Essential to further a compelling governmental interest; and

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2. The least restrictive means of furthering that compelling
2 governmental interest.

3	C. Any order or rule issued by any governmental entity pursuant
4	to an emergency that requires closure of any place of worship
5	entitled to the religious exemption found in Section 501(c)(3) of
6	Title 26 of the United States Code shall be considered a substantial
7	burden even if the order or rule is one of general applicability.
8	D. A school or school district policy prohibiting students from
9	wearing tribal regalia during high school graduations, if that
10	conduct is motivated by the religious beliefs of the student, shall
11	be considered to substantially burden the student's free exercise of
12	religion. For purposes of this section, a "compelling governmental
13	interest" shall not include the school policy described in this
14	subsection if the interest is primarily a mere desire for aesthetic
15	uniformity.
16	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
