11	An Act relating to game and fish; amending 29 O.S. 2011, Section 3-103, as last amended by Section 1,
12	Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2017 (29 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 3-103), which relates to the Wildlife Conservation
13	Commission; modifying authority relating to the acquisition of land; requiring land to be publicly
14	offered for sale at fair market value; providing exception; and providing an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2011, Section 3-103, as
19	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2017 (29 O.S. Supp.
20	2020, Section 3-103), is amended to read as follows:
21	Section 3-103. A. The Wildlife Conservation Commission shall
22	constitute an advisory, administrative and policymaking board for
23	the protection, restoration, perpetuation, conservation,
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supervision, maintenance, enhancement, and management of wildlife in
 this state as provided in the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code.

B. The Director shall consult with the Commission regarding the
administration of the affairs of the Department of Wildlife
Conservation. The Commission is authorized and empowered to require
from the Director complete reports and information relative to the
affairs of the Department at the time and in the manner the
Commission may deem advisable.

9 C. The Commission shall meet in regular session at least nine times per year not to exceed one meeting per month with not more 10 11 than two consecutive calendar months between meetings and in special 12 sessions as may be called by the Chair or a majority of the 13 Commission. The Commission may hold any regular or special session 14 at any location within this state. Should a location be chosen 15 other than Commission headquarters in Oklahoma City for a regular or 16 special meeting, notice shall be posted at Commission headquarters 17 in Oklahoma City and advertised in the local newspaper of the city 18 in which the meeting is to be held, at least one time during each of 19 the two (2) weeks prior to the meeting. The advertisements shall 20 include time, date  $\tau$  and address of location of the meeting.

D. In addition to the other powers and duties prescribed by law, the Commission shall:

23 1. Institute an affirmative action plan for hiring women and 24 minorities throughout the agency;

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1 2. Elect a chair, vice-chair, and secretary, who shall perform 2 the duties required of them by statutes, rules of the Commission $\overline{r}$ and the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. The chair, vice-3 4 chair, and secretary shall receive no extra compensation; 5 3. Appoint a Director, and determine the qualifications of the Director and all assistants and employees. A Commissioner shall not 6 7 be eligible for employment in any position within the Department; 4. Prescribe rules and policies for the transaction of its 8 business and the control of the Department; 9 10 5. Develop and implement a plan to provide step raises for 11 Commission employees so that discrepancies of pay levels within a pay grade are eliminated; 12 13 6. Acquire by purchase, lease, gift<sub> $\tau$ </sub> or devise, waters, real 14 property, and personal property incident to the exercise of its 15 functions and to maintain, operate  $\tau$  and dispose of the same. The 16 Commission shall acquire real property by purchase only after the 17 property has been publicly advertised for sale for a minimum of six 18 (6) months and such property shall be acquired at fair market value. 19 Provided, however, when any real property becomes available for 20 purchase and the property is surrounded one hundred percent (100%) 21 by existing real property operated, controlled or owned by the 22 Commission, the Commission shall be authorized to acquire such 23 property whether such property has been publicly advertised for sale 24 for a minimum of six (6) months;

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7. Acquire real property by condemnation only when the Attorney
 General or other counsel deems it an appropriate means of clearing
 title from willing or unavailable sellers;

8. Supervise the establishment, extension, improvement, and
operation of the wildlife refuges, propagation areas or stations,
public hunting areas, public fishing areas, game management areas,
and fish hatcheries;

9. Prescribe the manner of cooperation with the Oklahoma 8 9 Tourism and Recreation Department, colleges and universities within 10 the state, other state agencies, any agency of the federal 11 government<sub> $\tau$ </sub> and any city, town, school district<sub> $\tau$ </sub> or any other agency 12 or organization in study of conservation and propagation of wildlife and in the establishment, maintenance $_{ au}$  and operation of visual 13 14 educational facilities, recreational facilities, and hunting and 15 fishing facilities, in the study and propagation of wildlife;

16 10. Supervise the letting of all contracts and purchases for 17 the Department, with all purchases of personal property to be made 18 through the Office of Management and Enterprise Services;

19 11. Authorize all claims or expenditures prior to incurring20 payment except as otherwise provided in this Code;

21 12. Prescribe rules on the use of Department-owned vehicles by 22 the Director, department heads and other essential employees as the 23 Commission deems necessary in order to perform their duties;

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1 13. Prescribe rules for the sale of all regular or special
 2 licenses;

3 14. Publicize and encourage the conservation and appreciation4 of wildlife and all other natural resources;

5 15. Regulate the seasons and harvest of wildlife;

6 16. Promulgate rules to sell fishing and hunting licenses via7 the Internet;

8 17. Annually report to the Governor and the Legislature on the
9 complete operation, activities, and plans of the Department,
10 together with such recommendations for future activities as the
11 Commission may deem to be in the best interest of the state; and
12 18. Provide the Governor and the Legislature with an annual
13 inventory of all property and equipment.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
