11	An Act relating to justifiable homicide; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 733, which relates to justifiable
12	homicide by other persons; authorizing court to order reimbursement of costs to defendant upon certain
13	finding; establishing burden of proof for certain showing; authorizing certain appeal to Court of
14	Criminal Appeals; authorizing denial or reduction in award of costs upon certain finding; providing for
15	applicability of provisions to certain prosecutions; updating statutory language; making language gender
16	neutral; and providing an effective date.

19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 733, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	Section 733. A. Homicide is also <u>shall be deemed</u> justifiable
23	when committed by any <u>a</u> person in any of the following cases:

1. When resisting any attempt to murder $\frac{\text{such the}}{\text{person}_{7}}$ or to commit any felony upon $\frac{\text{him the person}}{\text{house in which such}}$ the person is;

- 2. When committed in the lawful defense of such the person or of another, when the person using force reasonably believes such force is necessary to prevent death or great bodily harm to himself or herself or another or to terminate or prevent the commission of a forcible felony; or
- 3. When necessarily committed in attempting, by in a lawful ways and means, manner to apprehend any a person for any felony committed; or in lawfully suppressing any a riot; or in lawfully keeping and preserving the peace.
- B. When a defendant is found not guilty of murder due to justifiable homicide, the court may order the state to reimburse the defendant for reasonable costs including but not limited to loss of wages, court costs and attorney fees, and other expenses involved in his or her defense. Reimbursement of costs shall not constitute an independent cause of action. To order reimbursement of reasonable costs, the court shall find that the defendant showed by a preponderance of the evidence that the homicide was justified and determine the amount of the award. If the court finds that the defendant did not meet the burden of proof, the defendant may appeal such finding to the Court of Criminal Appeals.

Notwithstanding a finding of justifiable homicide pursuant to subsection B of this section, the court may deny or reduce the 2 amount of an award for reasonable costs if the court determines that 3 4 the defendant was engaged in criminal conduct substantially related 5 to the events resulting in the charges filed against the defendant. The court shall consider the seriousness of the initial criminal 6 7 conduct in making a determination for a denial or reduction of an award for reasonable costs. 8 9 D. The provisions of this section shall apply to any pending prosecution for an offense occurring prior to the effective date of 10 11 this act. E. As used in this section, "forcible felony" means any felony 12 13 which involves the use or threat of physical force or violence against any person. 14 SECTION 2.
