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9	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
10	An Act relating to state use; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3001, which relates to the State Use
11	Committee; providing entity name; modifying member of Council; requiring certain meetings; directing the
12	State Purchasing Director to administer the State Use Program; providing certain authority and
13	responsibilities; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3003, which relates to definitions; modifying certain
14	definitions; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3004, which relates to procurement schedules; modifying
15	entity responsible for procurement schedule; directing State Purchasing Director to award and
16	manage contracts to certain organizations; directing deposit of certain fee; amending 74 O.S. 2021,
17	Section 3004.1, which relates to contracts; authorizing certain contracts or awards; modifying
18	allowing expenditures; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3004.2, which relates to the State Use Committee
19	Revolving Fund; allowing certain fee or levy; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3005, which relates to
20	fair market pricing; modifying entity responsible for determining fair market price of certain products and
21	services; modifying time period for price changes to be effective; 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3006, which
22	relates to distribution agency; allowing the State Purchasing Director to contract with a third-party
23	for certain operations and distribution; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3007, which relates to procuring a
24	product or service at a certain price; modifying

1 procurement source; modifying entity responsible for determining fair market price; modifying procurement requirements; removing certain exemption; authorizing 2 municipalities and counties to make certain purchases from gualified organizations; amending 74 O.S. 2021, 3 Section 3008, which relates to exceptions; removing exemption; requiring certain pricing review; allowing 4 for temporary exception under certain circumstances; 5 allowing Central Purchasing Division to prescribe rules to carry out this act; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3009, which relates to annual reporting; 6 requiring certain report; repealing 74 O.S. 2021, Sections 3010, which relate exemptions; providing for 7 codification; and providing an effective date. 8 9

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

11 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3001, is 12 amended to read as follows:

Section 3001. A. There is hereby created in the Office of Management and Enterprise Services a committee <u>council</u> to be known as the "State Use <u>Committee Council</u>". The <u>Committee Council</u> shall consist of seven (7) members <u>and one nonvoting member as follows</u>:

A private citizen conversant with the employment needs of
 people with severe disabilities who shall be appointed by and serve
 at the pleasure of the Governor to act as an advocate for the
 employment needs of people with severe disabilities;

21 2. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 22 Services or designee;

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3. The Director of the Division of Services for the Blind and
 Visually Impaired of the State Department of Rehabilitation
 Services, or designee;

4 4. The past president of Oklahoma Community-Based Providers or
5 designee to serve for a one-year period, who may be reappointed by
6 the succeeding president One member who shall be appointed by the
7 President Pro Tempore of the Senate;

5. An individual or a parent or guardian of an individual with
severe disabilities who participates in vocational programming
through a sheltered environment facility qualified non-profit agency
for individuals with disabilities, to be selected by the Committee
appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

13 6. The Director of Human Services, or designee; and

14 7. A certified procurement officer from any state agency
15 appointed by the State Purchasing Director, selected to represent
16 the customer agencies of the State of Oklahoma; and

17 8. As a nonvoting member, a <u>A</u> person employed by the Office of
18 Management and Enterprise Services <u>Central Purchasing Division</u> as a
19 contracting officer in the purchasing division, appointed by the
20 State Purchasing Director with the advice of the Committee and
21 designated specifically to solicit, develop, and negotiate contracts
22 with agencies and individuals.

B. The Committee shall elect from among its membership a Chair
 and a Vice Chair who shall both serve for a period of one (1) year.

C. The private <u>citizen</u> <u>citizens</u> on the <u>Committee</u> <u>Council</u> shall serve for a period of two (2) years and may be reappointed by the appointing authority. Any private citizen appointed pursuant to this section to fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which the predecessor was appointed shall be appointed only for the remainder of the term.

D. Any member of the Committee shall be prohibited from voting
on any issue in which the member has an interest <u>The State Use</u>
<u>Council shall meet a minimum of twice a year for the purpose of</u>

10 exchanging ideas to market and improve the State Use Program.

11 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3001.1 of Title 74, unless there 13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 The State Purchasing Director, under the supervision of the 15 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, shall 16 have authority and responsibility to administer and oversee the 17 State Use Program including but not limited to:

18 1. Promulgating rules relating to the program;

19 2. Qualification of organizations participating in the program;

Contracting with qualified organizations for products and
 services to be included on the procurement schedule;

22 4. Determination of fair market price of all products and23 services to be included on the procurement schedule; and

5. Designation and publication of a procurement schedule.

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1SECTION 3.AMENDATORY74 O.S. 2021, Section 3003, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 3003. As used in this act Section 3001 et seq. of this
4 title:

1. "Blind person" means a person having a visual acuity not to
 exceed 20/200 in the better eye, with correcting lenses, or visual
 acuity greater than 20/200 but with limitation in the field of
 vision such that the widest diameter of visual field subtends an
 angle no greater than twenty (20) degrees;

10 2. "Committee <u>Council</u>" means the State Use <u>Committee Council</u>; 11 3. "Qualified nonprofit agency for the severely handicapped 12 <u>employment of individuals with disabilities</u>" means a nonprofit 13 agency:

employing severely disabled persons with disabilities 14 a. who constitute at least seventy-five percent (75%) of 15 the personnel direct labor hours engaged in direct 16 production, manufacturing, processing and/or 17 assembling of products or services offered by the 18 agency for procurement by this state and or who meet 19 the definition of "blind person" blind person as 20 provided for in paragraph 1 of this section, - or 21 b. which is certified as a sheltered workshop by the Wage 22 and Hour Division of the United States Department of 23 Labor; 24

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1 4. "Severely disabled person Individuals with disabilities" means an individual with a physical or mental disability 2 constituting a substantial handicap to employment and preventing the 3 person from engaging in normal competitive employment and/or 4 5 includes any blind person; 5. "Qualified organization" means a blind person, qualified 6 nonprofit agency for the severely handicapped, or severely disabled 7 person employment of individuals with disabilities contracting to 8 9 supply goods or services; "Manufactured" means goods made by manual labor; 10 6. 7. "Produced" means to have brought into existence or created 11 12 from raw materials; 8. "Processed" means the action of taking something through an 13 established and mostly routine set of procedures or steps to 14 substantially convert a potential product from one form to another. 15 This action involves a sequence of multiple steps each requiring a 16 distinct decision-making process to evolve a potential product to 17 the next step; and 18 9. "Assemble" means to put or fit together or put together the 19 parts of a potential product; 20 10. "Central nonprofit agency (CNA)" means a qualified 501(C)3 21 nonprofit entity meeting the qualifications in the Request for 22 Procurement (RFP) issued by the Office of Management and Enterprise 23 24

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Services selected to administer and oversee the State Use Program;
and

"Procurement schedule" means a designated schedule of 3 11. products and services currently approved by the Office of Management 4 5 and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division as suitable to procure from qualified organizations participating in the State Use 6 7 Program. SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3004, is 8 9 amended to read as follows: 10 Section 3004. The Committee Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division shall designate and distribute 11 by regulation a schedule, hereinafter referred to as the procurement 12 schedule, of the products directly manufactured, produced, processed 13 or assembled or services directly performed, offered or provided by 14 any severely disabled person individual with disabilities or 15 qualified nonprofit agency for the severely disabled employment of 16 individuals with disabilities, as defined by this act in Section 17 3003 of this title, which the Committee State Purchasing Director 18 determines are suitable for procurement by the state. The products 19 and services on contract will be published on the procurement 20 schedule and will be designated as mandatory. No state agency shall 21 purchase, pursuant to Section 3007 of this title, products or 22 services purporting to be made by severely disabled persons in 23 workshops which are not certified by the Committee or by severely 24

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1	disabled individuals who are not certified by the Committee The
2	Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing
3	Division shall have the authority to qualify organizations for
4	inclusion in the State Use Program, monitor qualified organizations
5	for continued compliance to remain active in the program and remove
6	organizations from the program. Central Purchasing shall have the
7	authority to award and manage contracts to the qualified
8	organizations as well as to renegotiate or cancel contracts when
9	appropriate.
10	SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3004.1, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	Section 3004.1. A one-percent fee of any contract for products
13	or services of the severely disabled shall be assessed against the
14	qualified organization and The State Purchasing Director may enter
15	or award contracts for products or services to a qualified
16	organization as defined in Section 3003 of this title and assess a
17	contract management fee or levy. The contract management fee or
18	levy shall be deposited in the State Use Committee Council Revolving
19	Fund, as created in Section 3004.2 of this title, for the salary,
20	administrative costs, annual trainings, professional association
21	memberships, qualified agency operational improvement grants,
22	periodic economic advantage study, Annual Report development and
23	other expenses incurred by the <u>Central</u> Purchasing Division of the
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Office of Management and Enterprise Services for promoting goods and
 services provided by qualified organizations.

3 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3004.2, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 3004.2. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Office of Management and Enterprise Services 6 to be designated the "State Use Committee Council Revolving Fund". 7 The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year 8 9 limitations, and shall consist of all proceeds from the one-percent management fee or levy on contracts for purchases of products or 10 services of the severely disabled individuals with disabilities, as 11 provided in Section 3004.1 of this title. The fund shall be 12 invested in any of the types of instruments in which the State 13 Treasurer is authorized by law to invest. Interest earned shall be 14 retained by the fund. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund 15 are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 16 17 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for the salary and other administrative expenses of the buyer and clerical and 18 technical support in the Central Purchasing Division of the Office 19 of Management and Enterprise Services responsible for contracts for 20 the products and services of the severely disabled individuals with 21 disabilities and expenses the Office incurs to support Committee 22 State Use operations including services of the Centralized Non-23 Profit Agency (CNA). Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon 24

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warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

4 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3005, is 5 amended to read as follows:

Section 3005. The Committee Office of Management and Enterprise 6 Services Central Purchasing Division shall determine the fair market 7 price of all products and services included in the procurement 8 9 schedule and shall revise such prices in accordance with changing market conditions; provided, however, a change in price shall not be 10 effective prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) thirty (30) days 11 12 from the date on which such change is made by the Committee 13 approved. Approved fair market prices shall be reflected on State Use contracts and procurement schedules within thirty (30) days of 14 15 approval and distribution. SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3006, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17 Section 3006. The Committee State Purchasing Director may 18

19 designate contract with a central nonprofit agency to facilitate
20 the:

<u>1. Management of the day-to-day operations of the program;</u>
 <u>2. The facilitation, promotion, and</u> the distribution of orders
 of the state for products or services on the procurement schedule

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1 among qualified nonprofit agencies for people with severe
2 disabilities;

3. Scheduling and conducting annual training sessions; 3 4. Publishing the approved State Use Procurement Schedule; 4 5 5. Promotion of the State Use program through development and distribution of program marketing material, promotion of program 6 through continued contact with current and future customers; and 7 6. All other duties assigned by the RFP through the Office of 8 9 Management and Enterprise Services. SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3007, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 12 Section 3007. A. Whenever the State of Oklahoma or any of its 13 agencies intends to procure any product or service included in the procurement schedule, that entity shall secure the product or 14 service from a qualified nonprofit agency providing employment to 15 people with severe disabilities at the fair market price determined 16 17 by the Committee Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division, if the product or service is available 18 within the period required by the entity and meets the 19 20 specifications of the entity. в. An agency of this state shall not evade the intent and 21 meaning of this section by slight variations from standards adopted 22 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central 23 Purchasing Division. 24

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C. Provided, the requirements of this section shall not apply to the procurement of janitorial services by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. The Bureau shall conduct background investigations and national criminal history record checks on companies and individuals with which it contracts to provide janitorial services.

D. When the fair market price for a product or service approved 7 by the Committee exceeds a current market price for the same product 8 9 or service, and such lower market price has been verified by the 10 agency through compliance with the fair market analysis process approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, the 11 12 state use contracting officer may grant a temporary exception to a 13 requesting agency so that the agency may purchase the product or service from the vendor offering the lower market price. The 14 temporary exception shall automatically expire when a new fair 15 market price is established by the State Use Committee Any 16 17 municipality or county agency of this state is authorized to purchase products and services from any qualified organization as 18 defined in Section 3003 of this title. The qualified organization 19 shall be able to meet the needs and specifications for the products 20 or services required by the purchasing body at the fair market 21 22 price. SECTION 10. 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3008, is AMENDATORY 23

24 amended to read as follows:

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1	Section 3008. <u>A.</u> Nothing in Sections 3001 et seq. of this
2	title pursuant to purchases of products and services from people
3	with severe disabilities shall be construed to prohibit any
4	department or agency of the state from manufacturing or supplying
5	its own products or services for its own use. Procurements made
6	pursuant to this act shall not be subject to the competitive bid
7	requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, Section 85.1 et
8	seq. of this title.
9	B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
10	Purchasing Division shall require an annual qualified organization
11	pricing review for all products and services approved and designated
12	on the procurement schedule. The method of the pricing review shall
13	be defined in the promulgated rules.
14	C. When the fair market price for a product or service approved
15	by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
16	Purchasing Division exceeds a current market price for the same
17	product or service, and such lower market price has been verified by
18	the agency through compliance with the fair market analysis process
19	approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services Central
20	Purchasing Division, the State Use contracting officer may grant a
21	temporary exception to a requesting agency so that the agency may
22	purchase the product or service from the supplier offering the lower
23	market price.

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1SECTION 11.AMENDATORY74 O.S. 2021, Section 3009, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 3009. A. The State Use Committee Office of Management 4 <u>and Enterprise Services Central Purchasing Division</u> shall prescribe 5 rules to carry out the purposes of the provisions of Sections 3001 6 through 3009 of this title.

7 B. The rules shall include requirements for:

Publishing a catalog listing goods and services and jobs
 that workshops qualified agencies employing individuals with
 <u>disabilities</u> can provide the state, annually; <u>and</u>

Conducting a minimum of six two meetings per year of the
 <u>State Use Council</u>, in compliance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act,
 Section 301 et seq. of Title 25 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

14 3. Making available to contractors the minutes of all meetings;

15 4. Notifying contractors at least ten (10) days prior to

16 meeting dates. Meetings shall be called by the Committee Chair; and

17 5. Establishing guidelines by which a vendor may file a

18 grievance.

19 C. The Committee shall report any violations of the intent of 20 the laws to the Attorney General's office within thirty (30) days of 21 their determination of such violations.

22 D. C. The Committee shall file an Annual Report On an annual 23 basis, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall within 24 sixty (60) days after the close of the legislative fiscal year,

1	transmit a strategic plan for the State Use Program with to the
2	President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
3	Representatives and the Governor.
4	SECTION 12. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2021, Section 3010, is
5	hereby repealed.
6	SECTION 13. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
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
