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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 383 of Title 3, unless there is
20	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Fly-In Oklahoma
22	Act".
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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 383.1 of Title 3, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created within the Oklahoma Aeronautics 4 Α. 5 Commission the Fly-In Oklahoma Program. The purpose of this program shall be to enhance and incentivize aviation and aerospace tourism 6 areas at publicly owned airports within the state through 7 opportunities to improve airports, terminal buildings, recreational 8 aviation activities, and other aviation travel-related 9 infrastructure as well as to advertise tourism opportunities to the 10 aviation community and enhance general awareness of the aviation and 11 12 aerospace industry. The program shall also promote fly-in events 13 and activities as well as encourage pilots and aviation enthusiasts to utilize the Oklahoma Airport System. The program shall be 14 administered by the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission in collaboration 15 with the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department. 16

в. Grants for publicly owned airports and municipalities or 17 public trusts, which operate publicly owned airports that are in the 18 Oklahoma Airport System, shall be available for development and 19 improvement of infrastructure and equipment that would support fly-20 in tourism, advertising of fly-in tourism, and general awareness of 21 the aviation industry within the state. Recipients that receive 22 funding from the Commission pursuant to this program shall be 23 required to keep track of tourism activities and uses of the grant 24

1	at their airport and report on an annual basis how this funding has
2	enhanced aviation and aerospace activity at their airport.
3	C. Contingent upon the availability of funds appropriated by
4	the Legislature, the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission may use
5	established processes or may contract with qualified entities to
6	carry out the duties and responsibilities of this program.
7	D. The Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission shall promulgate any
8	rules necessary to implement the provisions of the Fly-In Oklahoma
9	Program.
10	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
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
