Supp. 2020, Section 9030.5), which relates to allocation of funds for art in public places; exempting certain 10 agency for maintenance and certain repairs and 11 remodels; clarifying new construction project allocation of funds; providing an effective date; and 12 declaring an emergency. 13 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1. 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9030.5, as 16 AMENDATORY amended by Section 5, Chapter 196, O.S.L. 2015 (74 O.S. Supp. 2020, 17 Section 9030.5), is amended to read as follows: 18 Section 9030.5. A. 1. Except as otherwise provided by 19 subsection C of this section, all state agencies, including 20 institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, 21 all state departments, boards, councils, and commissions shall 22 allocate, as a nondeductible item out of any expenditures for 23 capital projects including, but not limited to, bond issues for 24

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state construction excluding costs for bond issuance and related
reserves, an amount of one and one-half percent (1 1/2%) of the
expenditure to the Oklahoma Arts Council for the purpose of funding
the Oklahoma Art in Public Places Act, except as otherwise provided
by subsection B of this section.

- 2. The maximum assessment for any project shall not exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). This assessment shall not apply to any private donations for a capital project. This allocation shall be applicable to all state agency capital projects approved by the appointing authority after September 1, 2004. The works of art commissioned pursuant to the Oklahoma Art in Public Places Act may be placed on public lands, integral to or attached to a public building or structure, or detached within or outside a public building or structure.
- B. 1. Of the assessment provided for in subsection A of this section, four-fifths (4/5) shall be placed in the Commissioning of Art in Public Places Revolving Fund, created in Section 9030.6 of this title, for the commission of any work of art for the Oklahoma Art in Public Places Act. Institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall remain in complete administrative control of their four-fifths (4/5) assessment pursuant to this subsection for the acquisition of art. The remaining one-fifth (1/5) of the assessment shall be reserved for the Art in Public

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- Places Administrative and Maintenance Revolving Fund created by
 Section 9030.7 of this title.
 - 2. Monies deposited in the Art in Public Places Administrative and Maintenance Revolving Fund for the purpose of this moratorium, shall be used for continued administration, educational $costs_{\tau}$ and maintenance.
 - C. The provisions of subsection A of this section shall not be applicable for the fiscal years ending:
 - 1. June 30, 2012;
 - 2. June 30, 2013; and
- 3. June 30, 2014 Department of Tourism when budgeting,

 contracting for and performing routine maintenance, repairs,

 remodels or pre-fabrication installations for existing state park

 lodges, buildings and structures; however, all new construction

 projects shall be required to comply with the provisions of

 subsection A of this section.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
