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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
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1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-201 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 3 4 There is hereby created until November 1, 2027, the Oklahoma Α. 5 Education Commission. 6 Β. The Commission shall consist of seventeen (17) members to be 7 appointed as follows: 1. A member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives shall be 8 9 appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives; 10 2. A member of the Oklahoma State Senate shall be appointed by 11 the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate; 12 3. The Director of the Department of Corrections, or his or her 13 designee; 14 The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Libraries, or his 4. 15 or her designee; 16 The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Educational 5. 17 Television Authority, or his or her designee; 18 6. Four members with expertise in online and educational 19 innovation shall be appointed by the Chancellor of Higher Education, 20 one of whom shall be a representative of the Oklahoma State Regents 21 for Higher Education, one of whom shall be a representative of a 22 research institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher 23 Education, one of whom shall be a representative of a regional 24 institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education,

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and one of whom shall be a representative of a community college
 within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education;

7. Four members with expertise in effective approaches to classroom instruction and learning or educational innovation shall be appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, one of whom shall represent the State Department of Education, one of whom shall be a school district administrator, one of whom shall be a certified classroom teacher, and one of whom shall be a high school student; and

10 Four members with expertise in effective approaches to 8. 11 career and technology education instruction and learning or 12 educational innovation shall be appointed by the Director of the 13 Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education, one of whom 14 shall represent the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology 15 Education, one of whom shall be an administrator of a state 16 technology center school or college, one of whom shall be a 17 certified teacher at a state technology center school or college, 18 and one of whom shall be a student enrolled at a state technology 19 center school or college.

C. The Commission shall hold an organizational meeting not later than ninety (90) days after the effective date of this act. The member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives shall serve as chair of the Commission and the member of the Oklahoma State Senate shall serve as vice-chair. A quorum of the membership of the

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Commission shall be required to approve any final action of the
 Commission. For purposes of this section, nine members shall
 constitute a quorum.

4 D. The Commission may meet as often as required to perform the5 duties imposed upon it, but shall meet at least quarterly.

E. The Commission shall engage multiple stakeholders in
research, evaluation, and information sharing to conduct a study on
how to improve the quality of instruction and learning through
distance and remote modalities. Topic areas of the study shall
include, but not be limited to:

- 11 1. Support infrastructure;
- 12 2. Open education resources;

13 3. Compliance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act;

- 14 4. Professional development; and
- 15 5. Modality research.

16 F. The Commission shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting 17 Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

18 G. Members of the Commission shall not receive compensation or19 travel reimbursement.

H. The Oklahoma House of Representatives shall provide staffand administrative support for the Commission.

I. The Commission shall submit a report of its findings and
recommendations no later than November 1, 2027, to the Governor, the

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1	President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, and the Speaker
2	of the Oklahoma House of Representatives.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
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
