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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10A O.S. 2021, Section 2-7-202, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 2-7-202. A. There is hereby created the Office of
18	Juvenile Affairs which shall be responsible for programs and
19	services for youthful offenders and juveniles alleged or adjudicated
20	to be delinquent or in need of supervision. Within The Executive
21	Director shall be responsible for established divisions and
22	appointing Division Directors within the Office of Juvenile Affairs
23	there is hereby created:
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1	1. The Division of Institutional Services which shall be
2	responsible for the institutions operated by or contracted for by
3	the Office of Juvenile Affairs;
4	2. The Division of Community-based Youth Services which shall
5	be responsible for contracting with, monitoring, evaluation and
6	support of community-based Youth Services Agencies;
7	3. The Division of Juvenile and Treatment Services which shall
8	be responsible for intake, probation and parole services,
9	supervision and placement of juveniles and the contracting for,
10	monitoring and evaluation of residential and treatment programs
11	other than institutions and community-based Youth Services Agencies;
12	and
13	4. Such other divisions specifically established by the
14	Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs, with the
15	approval of the Board.
16	The Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs, with
17	the approval of the Board, shall appoint a Director of the Division
18	of Institutional Services, a Director of the Division of Community-
19	based Youth Services, and a Director of the Division of Juvenile and
20	Treatment Services to serve as the administrative head of each
21	division, respectively. The Division Directors shall have at least
22	six (6) years of experience in the same or similar programs or
23	facilities as they are to supervise and a baccalaureate degree or
24	higher level of education.

B. Suitable office space shall be provided by the Office of
 Management and Enterprise Services to the Office of Juvenile
 Affairs, to the extent necessary for the Office to implement its
 jurisdictional duties provided by the Oklahoma Juvenile Code, and
 the Office may incur necessary expenses for office rent.

6 C. Effective July 1, 1995, the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall 7 be a Merit System agency and all employees of the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall be classified employees who are subject to the 8 9 Oklahoma Personnel Act and the Merit System of Personnel 10 Administration, except as otherwise provided by law. Effective June 11 1, 2020, employees hired for service at the Southwest Oklahoma 12 Juvenile Center in Manitou shall be considered unclassified and 13 employed in a term-limited appointment. If state services continue 14 at the facility after the designated term, the employee may be 15 transferred into a non-term-limited position. Current employees and 16 employees hired prior to June 1, 2020, shall not be subject to this 17 provision.

D. Effective July 1, 1995, within its jurisdictional areas of responsibility, the Office of Juvenile Affairs, acting through the Executive Director, or persons authorized by law, rule or designated by the Executive Director to perform such acts, shall have the power and duty to:

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Advise, consult, cooperate and enter into agreements with
 agencies of the state, municipalities and counties, other states and
 the federal government, and other persons;

2. Enter into agreements for, accept, administer and use,
disburse and administer grants of money, personnel and property from
the federal government or any department or agency thereof, or from
any state or state agency, or from any other source, to promote and
carry on in this state any program within its jurisdictional area of
responsibility;

10 3. Require the establishment and maintenance of records and 11 reports;

Establish a system of training for personnel in order to
 assure uniform statewide application of law and rules;

14 5. Enforce the provisions of the Oklahoma Juvenile Code and15 rules promulgated thereunder and orders issued pursuant thereto;

16 6. Charge and receive fees pursuant to fee schedules
17 promulgated by the Board of Juvenile Affairs;

18 7. Conduct studies, research and planning of programs and 19 functions, pursuant to the authority granted by the Oklahoma 20 Juvenile Code;

Enter into interagency agreements;

9. Provide administrative and support services to the Board of
Juvenile Affairs as necessary to assist the Board in the performance
of their duties;

10. Establish and maintain such facilities and institutions as
 are necessary or convenient for the operation of programs for
 3 children under the jurisdiction of the Office of Juvenile Affairs;

Lease, from time to time, any real property which the Board
of Juvenile Affairs shall determine advisable to more fully carry
into effect the operation of the Office of Juvenile Affairs in
accordance with applicable state statutes. All such leases for real
property shall be subject to the provisions of Section 63 of Title
74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

10 12. Purchase or lease any equipment, supplies or materials 11 pursuant to the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act;

12 13. Contract for professional services;

13 14. Acquire, construct, extend, and operate any and all 14 facilities of all kinds which in the judgment of the Executive 15 Director and the approval of the Legislature shall be necessary or 16 convenient to carry out the duties of the Office of Juvenile 17 Affairs, as authorized by law; and

18 15. Exercise all incidental powers which are necessary and 19 proper to implement and administer the purposes of the Oklahoma 20 Juvenile Code.

E. The Office of Juvenile Affairs shall maintain a fair, simple and expeditious system for resolution of grievances of all persons committed to the Office of Juvenile Affairs regarding the substance or application of any written or unwritten policy, rule of the Board

of Juvenile Affairs or of an agent or contractor of the Office of
 Juvenile Affairs or any decision, behavior or action by an employee,
 agent or contractor or by any other person committed to the Office
 of Juvenile Affairs.

Effective November 1, 2012, the Office of Juvenile Affairs 5 F. shall establish a system of certification in accordance with the 6 7 Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act for the shelters 8 managed and operated by the Department of Human Services pursuant to 9 the requirements of Section 1-9-111 of this title. The Office of 10 Juvenile Affairs shall certify shelters pursuant to the requirements 11 of existing rules as established by the Oklahoma Commission on 12 Children and Youth until such time the Office of Juvenile Affairs 13 has promulgated rules for the certification of shelters. 14 SECTION 2.
